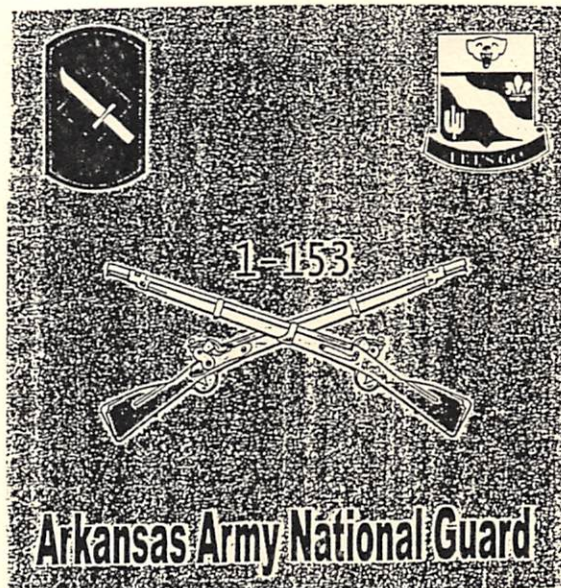

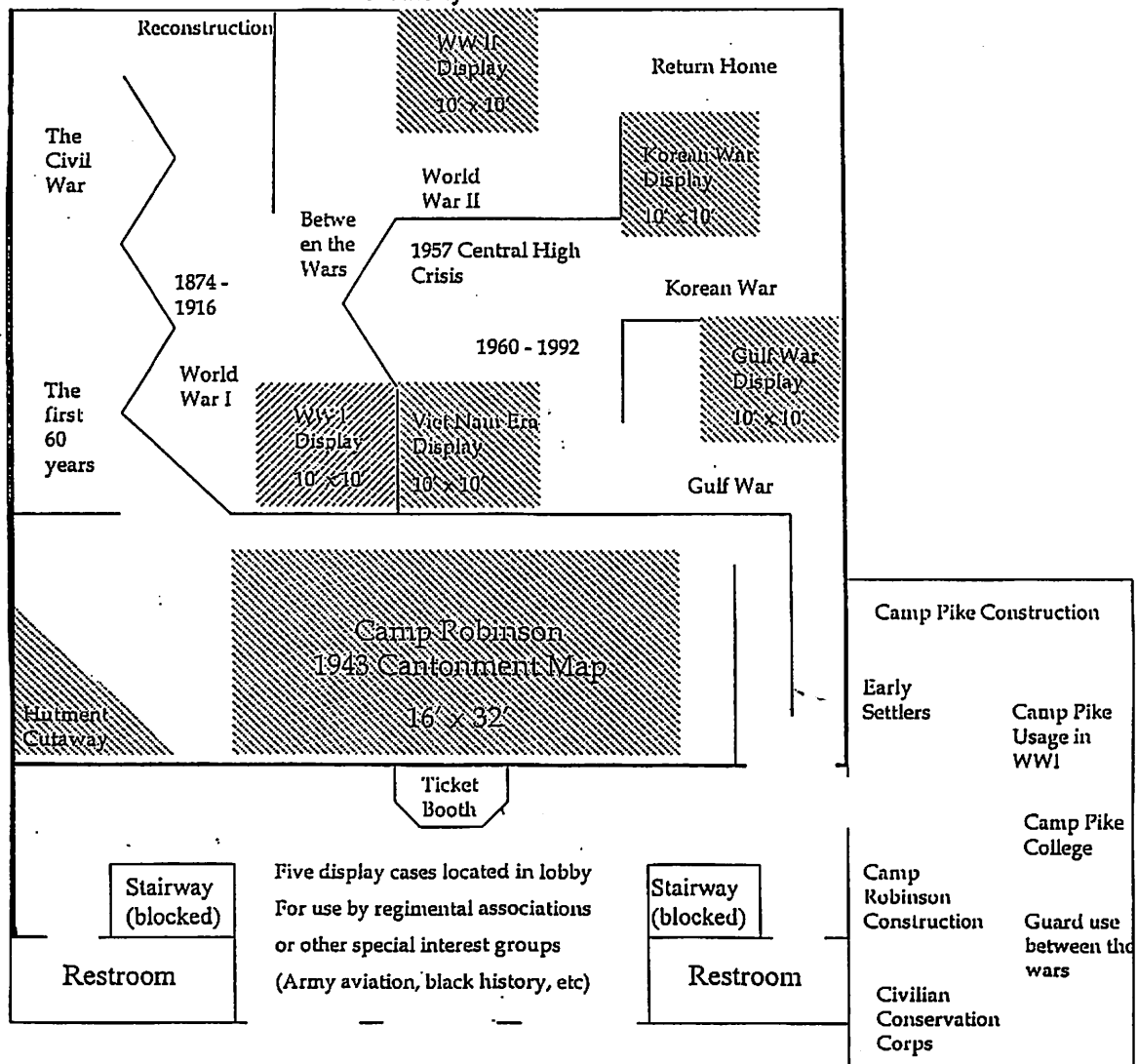

FIRST REGIMENT, ARKANSAS VOLUNTEER INFANTRY
HISTORICAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL

Organized from selected companies of Arkansas State Guard at Camp Dodge, Little Rock, By Gov. D. W. Jones, upon call of president, received April 25, 1898; muster-in completed May 20, 1000 men and officers. Ordered to Chickamauga Park, Ga., May 23; departed May 25; arrived May 27; assigned to 1st Brigade, 2d Division, 3d Army Corps. There fully armed and equipped; ordered to Porto Rico, with Gen. Wade's proposed expedition, but order countermanded before movement begun, because of cessation of hostilities; remained in camp there until September 25, 1898, when ordered to Fort Logan H. Roots, Little Rock, where mustered out October 25, 1899. Was never permitted to engage in any active service. Suffered severely from malarial, typhoid and other fevers and dysentery, the result of improper sanitary arrangements, and crowded condition of Camp George H. Thomas, Chickamauga Park.

Col. Elias Chandler ---- Graduated U. S. Military Academy 1880, assigned as Second Lieutenant 16th U. S. Infantry; promoted to First Lieutenant April 14, 1887; served with regiment and as Indian agent, on Western frontier, until October, 1892; participated in Sioux campaign near Pine Ridge winter 1891; as recruiting officer, David's Island, N.Y., October, 1892, to February, 1894; on detached duty as Professor of Military Science and Tactics at University of Arkansas, Fayetteville, Ark., from February, 1894, to February, 1898; rejoined regiment, Fort Sherman, Idaho; left with regiment for Chickamauga Park, April 21, 1898; leave of absence granted same day to accept Colonelcy 1st Ark. Vol Inf., reported to Governor April 28; mustered in as Colonel May 20; served with regiment and as

brigade commander until mustered out with regiment October 25, 1898, at Fort Logan H. Roots, Little Rock, Ark.

Promoted to Captain and assigned to 1st U.S. Inf. April 26, 1898; Joined regiment Huntsville, Ala., and went to Cuba in command of battalion December, 1898; on duty at Pinar del Rio until January 27, when assigned as Collector of Customs at port of Sagua la Grande, and now on that duty.

Lt. Col. John Morgan Dugan---Received military training at St. John's College, Little Rock; enlisted Capital City Guards, A.S.G., in 1880; promoted to Second Lieutenant, and in 1882 to First Lieutenant; commissioned Captain McCarthy Light Guards, A.S. G., March 1889; commanded same at competitive drills at Galveston in 1889, Atlanta in 1890 and Indianapolis in 1891 ; commissioned Lieutenant Colonel 1st Ark. Vol. Inf., U.S.V. May 9, 1898, and with regiment throughout its service, commanding same great part of the time. Mustered out with regiment.

Major Greenfield Quarles, Helena, Ark.---A veteran of the Confederate service in the Civil War, where he was one of the youngest soldiers. Was in many hard fought battles, notably at Franklin, Tenn., under Gen. Cleburne, where he was severely wounded. Since surrender, has devoted himself successfully to law politics and planting. Service as Major in 1st Ark. eminently capable and satisfactory throughout.

Maj. Clement R. Schaer, Little Rock ---Served continuously with State Guard since beginning of Brooks and Baxter War in 1874; enlisted then promoted to First Lieutenant of Cavalry and highly recommended by Gen. Churchill for dash and gallantry; later, First Lieutenant Co. B. Mask's battalion, and Captain of Little Rock Light Infantry, which was called out on State service two or three times, and of Capital City Guard; Chief of Ordnance on staff of Gen. Taylor, A.S.G., during railroad strike troubles at

Little Rock in 1894; Captain Battery A, four years; military attaché to Gov. Clark in 1896 and promoted to Major of Artillery; commissioned Brigadier General, A.S.G., by Gov. Jones March, 1897, and assigned to command of Southern Military Division of the State; Major of 1st Ark. Vol. Inf. throughout its service, and honorably mustered out with the regiment. Accidentally shot and instantly killed himself while hunting near Little Rock, November 11, 1899. A genial gentleman always, and a capable officer, he is greatly missed in militia circles.

Major and Surgeon J. Cabell Minor, Hot Springs--- Enlisted and organized Co.A, 3d Regt., A.S.G., May, 1897; commissioned Major and Surgeon, A.S.G, August 1897 served throughout as Major and Surgeon of 1st Ark. Vol. Inf., acting during a great part of the time as Brigade and Division Surgeon. On December 1, 1898, he was appointed Acting Assistant Surgeon, U.S. A., and served until July 10, 1899, when he was appointed Captain and Assistant Surgeon of the 20th Inf., U.S.V., and went shortly after with his regiment to the Philippines, and is still in service there.

First Lt. and Asst. Surgeons E.C. Hay of Hot Springs, and C. P. Merriwether, of Walnut Ridge, served throughout with the regiment, and were mustered out with it and returned to their practice in civil life.

First Lt. and Adjut. Farrar L. McCain, of Little Rock, was a sergeant in the Signal Corps, A.S.G., a lawyer by profession and served throughout as Adjutant.

First Lt. and Qmr. H.D. Moore, of Helena, received military instruction under Col. Chandler at the University of Arkansas, and served throughout as Quartermaster of the regiment.

Chaplain William Cross--- Born and educated in New York City, and a minister in the Episcopal Church in Mississippi

and Arkansas for many years; Chaplain of "Meridian Rifles," of Mississippi, and 3d Regt., A.S.G., residing at Hot Springs, when appointed Chaplain in 1st Ark. Vol. Inf.; was with the regiment throughout its service, devoted and faithful, and relieved much suffering by his attention to the men of his regiment in the hospitals at Chickamauga Park.

Sgt. Maj. Furth and Qmr. Sgt. McAney were enlisted men in the 16th Inf. and were discharged by request of Col. Chandler to take the positions with the 1st Ark., and served throughout as such.

Company A---- Organized September 4, 1893, as Co. K, 1st Regt. Reorganized June 23, 1897, as Co. A, 3d Regt., A.S.G., at Hot Springs. Volunteered promptly, recruited up to proper strength and one of the first companies to be mustered in at Camp Dodge. Capt. Wooten had seen service in Texas National Guard; 2d Lt. Dengler, military instruction under Col. Chandler at the University, and has since been commissioned in the U.S. Army.

Company B---Jefferson Fencibles, Pine Bluff. Organized November 11, 1897, as Co. E, 3d Regt., A.S.G.*(Succeeding the "Jefferson Guards," Co.F, First Regiment)* Went into camp immediately upon call of Governor, April 25, and reported Camp Dodge May 4. Capt Braley was one of the youngest officers in the regiment, and both he and 1st Lt. Hudson had military training under Col. Chandler at the University. Lt. Hudson was on August, 24, 1899, appointed 2d Lt. 38th U.S.V., went with his regiment, and both he and 1st Lt. Hudson had military training under Col. Chandler at the University. Lt. Hudson was on August, 24, 1899, appointed 2d Lt. 38th U.S.V., went with his regiment to Philippines, where he is still in service. Second Lt. Smith

was Sergeant in the Jefferson Guards from 1893, and 2d Lt. upon its reorganization as the Jefferson Fencibles.

Company C---Organized and equipped as Artillery, Battery B, at Fort Smith, in summer of 1897; no artillery being called for from this State, the battery volunteered as infantry and was mustered in and assigned to this regiment.

Company D---Organized July 27, 1893, as Co. G, 2d Regt., A.S. G. Reorganized as Co.D, 3d Regt., A.S.G., June, 1897, at Fort Smith; one of first companies to volunteer and be mustered-in. All of the officers had received military instruction at the University under Col. Chandler. Capt. Armistead resigned July 25, 1898, to accept appointment as 2d Lt. 3d Art., U.S.A, and has since seen service in Cuba.

Company E---Organized as Co. E, 1st Regt., A.S.G., May 21, 1891, at Hope; reorganized in April, 1898, and consolidated with Co.G, 3d Reg., located at DeQueen, Lt. Krause, of the DeQueen company, becoming Second Lieutenant of Co. E. After muster-out Capt. White was appointed First Lieutenant in 33d Inf., U.S.V., and went to the Philippines, where he died in service, of illness, April 10, 1900.

Company F----Organized as Co. I, 4th Regt., A.S.G., September, 1897. Capt. Long, after muster-out, was appointed First Lieutenant in 33d Inf., U.S.V., and went to Philippines, where still in service.

Company G (Helena Light Guards)---- Organized at Helena in 1892 as Co. G, 1st Regt. Inf., A.S.G.; afterwards attached to 4th Regt. Attended State Drills in 1892 and 1893, and took prize at inter-State Drill at Little Rock in 1894; did three days' service for State during railroad strike in 1894. Reported Camp Dodge May 4, and mustered in May 17. Capt. Sanders was a graduate of the Helena High School, First Lt. Pillow, of the Bingham Military School,

and 2d Lt. Fritzon of Bethel College, Ky., and all had served with the company from its organization.

Company H----Organized for service in Spanish War. All of the officers having had military instruction at college. 2d Lt. Elliott was, after muster-out, appointed 2d Lt. of Inf., U.S.A.

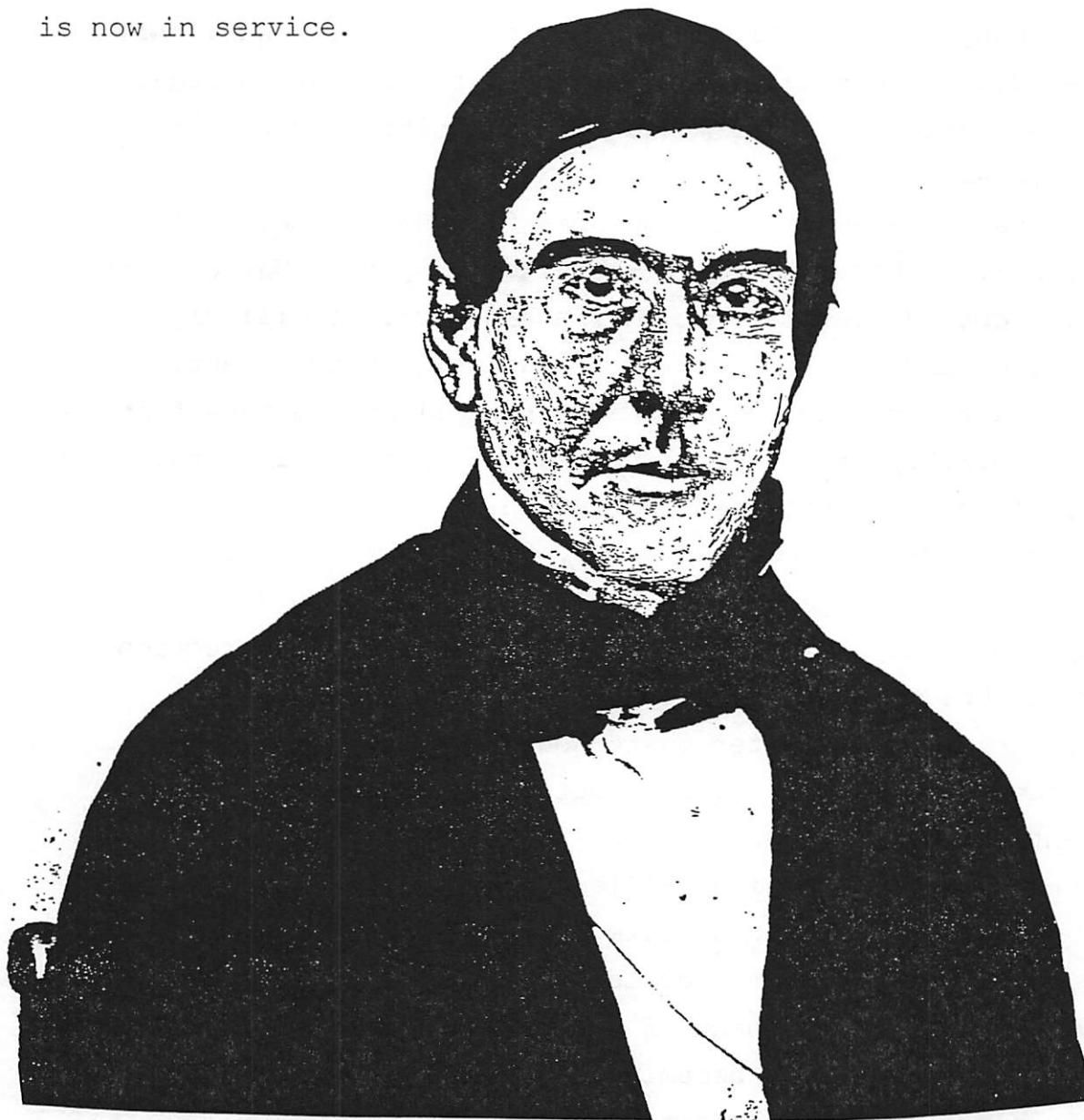
Company I-----Organized October 3, 1893; as Co. A, 1st Regt., A.S.G. Reorganized for service in Spanish War at Van Buren. Capt. Jeffers and Lt. Moore had received military instruction under Col. Chandler at the University. Capt. Jeffers, after muster-out, was appointed First Lieutenant in 33d Inf. U.S.V., went to Philippines and is still in service there, having been promoted to Captain.

Company K-----Organized as Co. B, 2d Regt., A.S.G., July 1, 1893. Reorganized as Co. I, 3d Regt., A.S.G., March, 1898. Capt. Stroup had received military instruction under Lt. Col. DeRosey C. Cabell, 2d Ark., at the University. He was, after muster out, appointed First Lieutenant in 33d Inf., U.S.V., but resigned before the regiment went to the Philippines.

Company L----- "Chicot Rifles" Originally organized as Co. L 1st Regt., A.S.G., at Lake Village, by Capt. R. W. Reynolds; reorganized for service in Spanish War and consolidated with a company of volunteers from Texarkana under Capt. Haywood, he becoming Captain on consolidation and Reynolds First Lieutenant. 2d Lt. Courtney was appointed Second Lieutenant in 40th Inf., U.S.V. in summer of 1899, and went to Philippines, where he is now in service.

Company M----"Greene Riffls." Organized for service in Spanish War. Capt. Elliott is a graduate of the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, but had retired to civilian life before outbreak of Spanish War. Lt. Kelso, after being

mustered out, was appointed Second Lieutenant in 40th Inf., U.S.V., and went to Philippines with the regiment, where he is now in service.



DR. RODERICK DODGE

On May 2, 1898 Governor Daniel Jones of Arkansas issued General Order No. 2 establishing Camp Dodge. The site was at the corner of College Avenue and Seventh Street in Little Rock. The camp was named for Dr. Roderick Dodge to whose estate the site of the camp belonged and whose heirs donated the land for military use.

THIRTY-NINTH ARKANSAS INFANTRY
Retyped from the Capsule of Histories of Arkansas Military

The Thirty-Ninth Arkansas Infantry was organized in the spring of 1863 to fill the void created by the transfer of troops to the eastern bank of the Mississippi River. Some members of the regiment had been recruited in the counties bordering on the Mississippi River and few members came from the village of Tulip, Arkansas.

Like almost all Civil War units, the Thirty-Ninth Arkansas Infantry was frequently know by an alternate designation derived from the name of the unit's commanding officer. Frequently, also, designation of this type were taken from the name of an officer in charge of a detachment of the command at some specific time or place. Alternate, unofficial designations of this type are listed below.

R. A. Hart's Infantry

J.W. Rogan's Infantry

C.N. Biscoe's Infantry

W.F. Rector's Infantry

P.M. Cobbs' Infantry

Lieutenant W. F. Rector named above was the son of the war-time governor of the state of Arkansas, Henry M. Rector. The Lieutenant was killed in the unit's first engagement, the Attack on Helena, Ark., July 4, 1863. Eight other officers of the unit were wounded at that engagement. Seven enlisted men were killed and thirty-eight wounded. Additionally, five officers were reported as missing or captured and thirty-four enlisted men.

The regiment's second and final commander, J.W. Rogan, had seen previous experience in the Thirtieth Arkansas Infantry.

The regiment spent its entire career in the Trans-Mississippi Department. Listed below are the two higher commands found in which the regiment served.

April 20, 1863 McRae's Brigade, Price's Division, District of Arkansas, Trans-Mississippi Department

January 31, 1864 Churchill's Brigade, Price's Division, District of Arkansas, Trans-Mississippi Department

The Thirty-Ninth Arkansas Infantry participated in the following engagements.

Attack, Helena, Ark.

July 4, 1863

Operations against Steele's

March 23- May 3, 1864

Expedition from Little Rock to Camden, Ark.

Engagement, Jenkin's Ferry, Saline River

April 30, 1864

A command known as "Rogan's Arkansas Infantry" was included in the list of troops surrendered by General Kirby Smith at Galveston, Texas, June 2, 1865. This was probably the Thirty-Ninth Arkansas Infantry.

No estimate can be made of the number of troops still with the unit at the time of the surrender. It will be seen that the regiment took part in very little active military duty during its career. Many units in a similar situation suffered a higher than average rate of desertion. The Thirty-Ninth Arkansas Infantry was probably similarly effected.

COAT OF ARMS

On January 6, 1930, the following coat of arms for the 153rd Infantry, Arkansas National Guard, under the provisions of paragraph 3, AR 260-10, June 30, 1926, was approved by the Secretary of War.

Shield--Azure, a bend wavy between a fleur-de-lis and a giant cactus argent.

Crest--That for the regiments of the Arkansas National guard: On a wreath of the colors (argent and azure) above two sprays of apple blossoms proper a diamond argent charged with four mullets azure, one in upper point and three in lower, within four mullets azure, one in upper point and three in lower, within a border of the last bearing twenty-five mullets of the second.

Motto-- Let's Go.

Description--The 153rd Infantry, Arkansas National Guard, was organized in 1898 as the First Infantry, Arkansas State Guard. In 1907, the regiment was redesignated the First Infantry, Arkansas National Guard. The regiment remained in the service of the state until June 1917, when it was mustered into federal service for service on the Mexican Border. It served on the Mexican Border during the disturbances of 1916-17 and was mustered out in February, 1917.

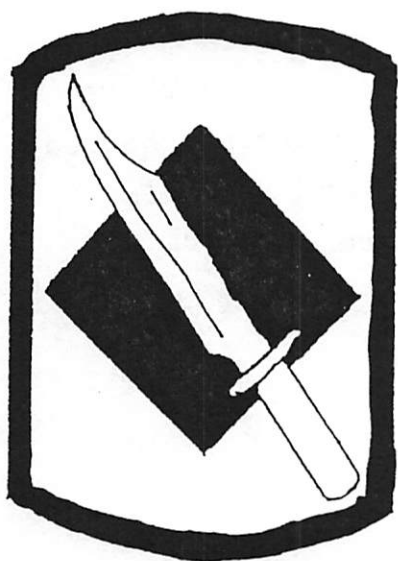
The regiment was again mustered into federal service for the World War and was redesignated the 153rd Infantry of

the 39th Division. The 153rd Infantry served overseas during the World War but was not engaged in combat. It was disbanded at Camp Beauregard, La., in January, 1919.

The First Infantry, Arkansas National Guard, which served during the World War as the 153rd Infantry, 39th Division, is now reconstituted in the National Guard of Arkansas as the 153rd Infantry.

Under the provisions of G.O. 16, W. D., 1921, as amended, the 153rd Infantry, Arkansas National Guard, is entitled to bear on its color a streamer denoting service in the World War with no inscription.

39th Infantry Brigade (Sep)



The Brigade patch is worn by all members of the 39th Brigade on the upper left sleeve. On it, the Bowie knife alludes "The Bowie State", a nickname used for Arkansas, home station of the Brigade. The Bowie knife, a weapon used for close fighting and implying hand-to-hand combat, is also indicative of the aggressive spirit of the Infantry. The lozenge or diamond refers to the unique aspect of the state as having the only diamond field in North America.

153rd Infantry



The 1st, 2nd and 3rd Battalions of the 153rd Infantry share the motto of "Let's Go" on their crest of blue and silver. The shield is blue for Infantry. The wavy band, representing the Arkansas River, refers to the geographic location of the regiment. The cactus symbolized service on the Mexican border and the fleur-de-lis, service in France during World War I. The Polar Bear represents the World War II Alaskan campaign.

OUTLINE OF HISTORY OF 153RD INFANTRY

ARKANSAS NATIONAL GUARD

1. First Arkansas Infantry, State Guard, mobilized May 16, 1898, and assigned to First Brigade, Second Division, Third Army Corps. Mustered out October 25, 1898. Spanish-American War service.

Location of organizations composing the First Arkansas Infantry volunteers, 1898: Company A, Hot Springs; Company B, Pine Bluff; Company C, Fort Smith; Company D, Fort Smith; Company E, Hope; Company F, Springdale; Company G, Helena; Company H, Arkadelphia; Company I, Van Buren; Company K, Paris; Company L, Texarkana; Company M, Camden; Field and Staff, Band and Medical Detachment, Little Rock.

2. Re-organization of First Arkansas State Guard, Infantry, continued after muster out of Federal service as shown by State appropriation made to care for same. Act CXVII, April 13, 1899.

Roster of towns showing location of units as provided for in appropriation of the Legislature of April 13, 1899, not available. The old records seem to have lost pages 3 to 26 inclusive. Page 36, however, shows the organization in 1901 and 1902 as follows: Headquarters, Helena; Company A, Morrilton; Company B, Denning; Company C, Siloam Springs; Company D, Eureka; Company E, Beebe; Company F, Harrison; Company G, Newport; Company H, Walnut Ridge; Company I, Paragould; Company K, Jonesboro; Company L, Black Rock; Company M, Newark; these towns are no doubt the same as in reorganization of regiment in 1899.

3. First Infantry organization, re-organized in accordance with G.O. 222, W. D. 1907, per G.O. 30, A.G.O.,

Dec. 10, 1907, designated as First Regiment Arkansas National Guard, Infantry.

4. First Infantry, Arkansas National Guard, mobilized June 19, 1916, per G. O., A.G.O. No.10 for Mexican Border service. Mustered out in February, 1917.

5. First Infantry Arkansas National Guard mobilized March 31, 1917, for World War service and designated as 153rd Infantry, by order of War Department upon creation of 39th Infantry Division. Camp Beauregard, Louisiana.

3. Company commanders are charged with subsisting the enlisted men of the National Guard reporting at their respective home stations, and for this purpose they will be limited to an allowance of seventy-five cents per day for each enlisted man actually present for duty as shown by the morning report. Vouchers to cover subsistence will be rendered to Major Eugene B. Jett, U. S. Disbursing Officer, Little Rock, every four days. Upon receipt of same by the disbursing officer, check to cover will be forwarded. All vouchers must be made out in the name of persons furnishing the meal, and signed by him and properly certified by Company Commander. Enlisted men of battalion and regimental headquarters will be attached for rations to the company located at their home station. Where there are no companies at their home station, battalion and regimental commanders will provide for commutation of ration for the enlisted men of their headquarters, as do company commanders for the commutation of the ration for their companies.

4. All officers and enlisted men should be examined by a physician, preferably by an officer of the Medical Corps, prior to their leaving their company rendezvous with a view to determining the presence of any infectious diseases. As it is probable that it will be impossible to have this examination made by an officer of the Medical Corps, an effort should be made to obtain the services of some patriotic physician or physicians for this purpose. There are no funds available for this expenditure.

5. The drill and instruction of all organizations will be commenced at once, company commanders arranging the schedule of drills, so as to have at least five hours drill each day. The Articles of War will be read at the first assembling of organizations in pursuance of this order, and will be read to all men subsequently joining by enlistment or otherwise.

6. Commanding officers of organizations will cause them to be recruited to the minimum strength given below:

Company of Infantry: Three officers and 141 enlisted men. Before leaving the home station, every effort should be made to reject all members of the company who do not meet the physical standard of the army; a physical examination will be made at the mobilization camp when all falling below this standard will be rejected. Here again the services of patriotic physician will be of value to a company commander. As there are no funds available for this expenditure, the accomplishment of this will depend upon the enterprise of the company commander.

7. Company commanders are designated as the representatives of the Governor to act with the designated mustering officers of the United States to inventory and inspect all property belonging to United States taken by the

National Guard into the Federal Service. Preparatory to making this transfer every company commander will take before leaving his home station, or cause to be taken, an inventory by actual count, of all the property now in his possession, or with which he is charged. This inventory by actual count shall cover all the property issued to the company from whatever source. All property not be taken into the service of the United States will be promptly shipped to the State Arsenal and invoiced to and receipt for by Major E. B. Jett. All property to be taken into the service of the United States will, as soon as a regiment or other separate organization has been mustered into the service of the United States, be invoiced by the company commander, or commanding officer of each separate organization as follows:

(a) Clothing, camp and garrison equipage, subsistence and quartermaster supplies to the quartermaster.

(b) Property pertaining to the Medical Department to the senior Medical Officer.

(c) Property pertaining to the Corps of Engineers, Ordnance Department, and the Signal Corps to an accountable officer detailed by the regimental or their commander of a separate organization from his Staff.

Property pertaining to each department will be invoiced separately.

Receipts will be obtained in triplicate, one copy to be retained by the company commander, and two copies to be forwarded direct to the Adjutant General of the State. When the property is transferred in accordance with the foregoing authority, the company commander upon invoicing the same and obtaining the prescribed receipts therefor, and sending same to the Adjutant General, is relieved of further accountability for the property so transferred.

All other property belonging to the United States in the hands of other officers of the National Guard, will be in a similar way transferred to the proper U. S. Army officer. The duplicate receipts being sent to the Adjutant General.

8. Regimental and other commanders of separate organizations will forward direct to the Adjutant General of the State requisitions for clothing, equipment, and supplies necessary to care for their organization at the strength stated in paragraph 6.

9. Regimental commanders will detail the necessary number of officers to locate as many suitable animals as practicable and to obtain options to purchase same; options so obtained will be forwarded direct to the Adjutant General of the State.

10. As soon as an organization has been raised to the maximum practicable at its home station, and in no case until it shall have reached its prescribed peace minimum strength of sixty-five men, its property inventories completed, suitable arrangements made for caring for the armory and property to be left behind-in short, as soon as an organization is really ready to move to the mobilization camp, telegraphic notification to that effect will be furnished the Adjutant General, in order that appropriate orders may be issued from this office.

11. The oath of enlistment to be subscribed to by enlisted men is with the understanding that credit will be given in the extension of this contract for the period which he has already served under his current enlistment in the organized militia of this state.

12. Muster-in rolls will be prepared upon the blank forms supplied for that purpose and in accordance with models and detailed instructions accompanying the same.

Commanding officers will see that these rolls contain all information that might in any way effect pay, or which it might be necessary to consider in the settlement of claim for pensions. The muster in to the service of the United States therefor prescribed by the Secretary of War.

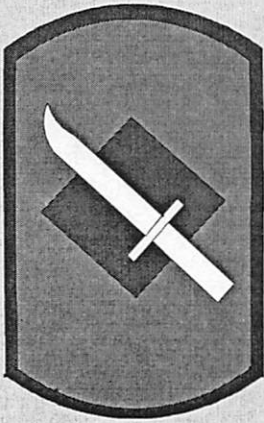

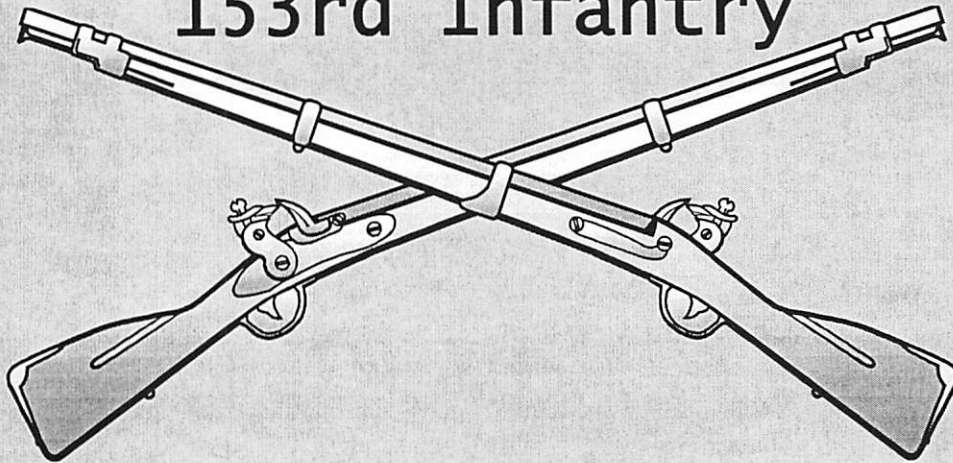

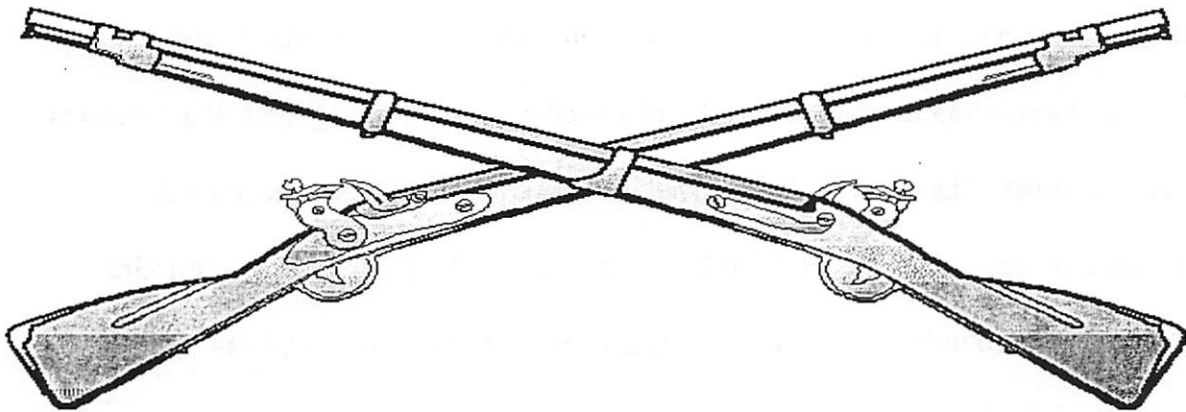
BRIEF HISTORY OF THE 153RD INFANTRY

The forerunner of the 153rd Infantry, the 1st Regiment of Infantry, was first organized in 1889 and located at Little Rock as a part of the Arkansas State Guard. It was later consolidated with 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Regiments of Infantry. Officially the 153rd Infantry was organized on May 16, 1898 when the mobilization of Arkansas Troops for the Spanish American War Service took place. Two regiments in 1898 were made up from selected companies from State Guard and mustered in as United States Volunteers. The First Arkansas Infantry, State Guard, was mobilized May 16, 1898, and assigned to First Brigade, Second Division, Third Army Corps. It was ordered first to Chickamauga Park, Georgia where they were stationed and then ordered to Puerto Rico. However, the order to Puerto Rico was countermanded due to cessation of hostilities. The men were then sent to Fort Logan H. Roots, Little Rock, Arkansas where they were mustered out on October 25, 1898, without having seen active federal service. The Arkansas State Guard was redesignated as the Arkansas National Guard in 1907.

The First Regiment of Infantry was called to federal service in 1916 for Mexican Border Service. The 1916 Mexican border mobilization was the first nation wide call up of the National Guard in U.S. History. They were again called in 1917 for assignment to the 39th Infantry Division, and were redesignated as the 153rd Infantry. The 153rd served overseas during World War I, but was not involved in combat. The unit was demobilized in January 1919 at Camp Beauregard, Louisiana. The unit was reorganized in 1920-21 in the Arkansas National Guard. The 153rd Infantry Regiment served in World War II from December 23, 1940 to June 30, 1944. The 153rd was inducted into federal service at Conway, Arkansas and assigned to the 2nd Army and moved to Camp Joseph T. Robinson, Arkansas in January 1941. They were transferred to Camp Forrest,

Tennessee on May 28, 1941 and returned to Camp Joseph T. Robinson on July 1, 1941 and assigned to 4th Army. They then staged at Camp Murry, Washington. The 1st and 3rd Battalions departed September 1, 1941 for duty at Seward, Nome, Yakutat, and Annette, Alaska. Regimental Headquarters departed Seattle for Fort Glenn, Alaska on April 25, 1942. The 2nd Battalion arrived at Adak, Alaska in February of 1943 and Kiska on August 19, 1943. The Regiment departed Alaska in February 1944 for Price Rupert, Canada. They inactivated in June 1944 at Camp Shelby, Mississippi. In 1946, they were assigned to the 39th Infantry Division. The 153rd was again ordered to Federal Service in 1957 at home stations during the Little Rock school crisis and released from federal service in 1958.

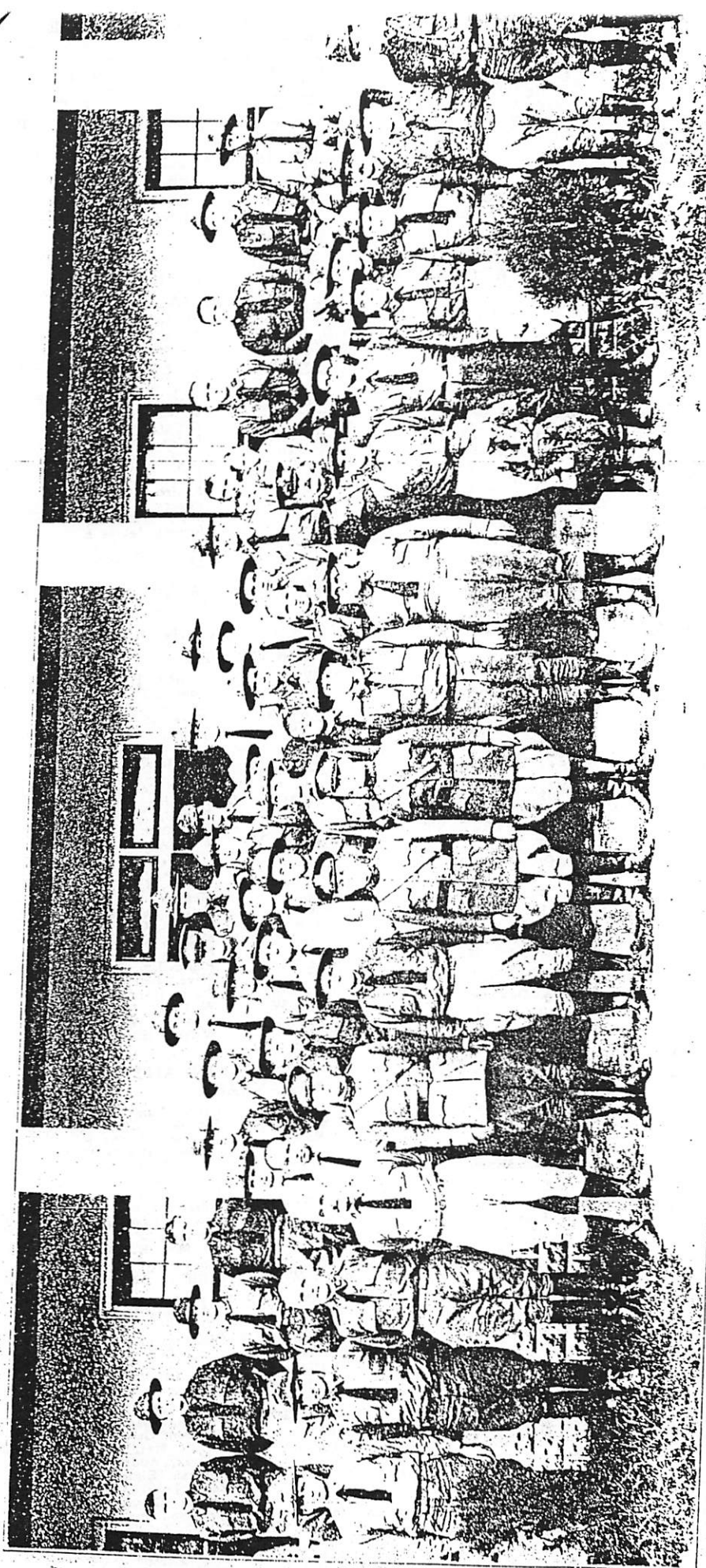
