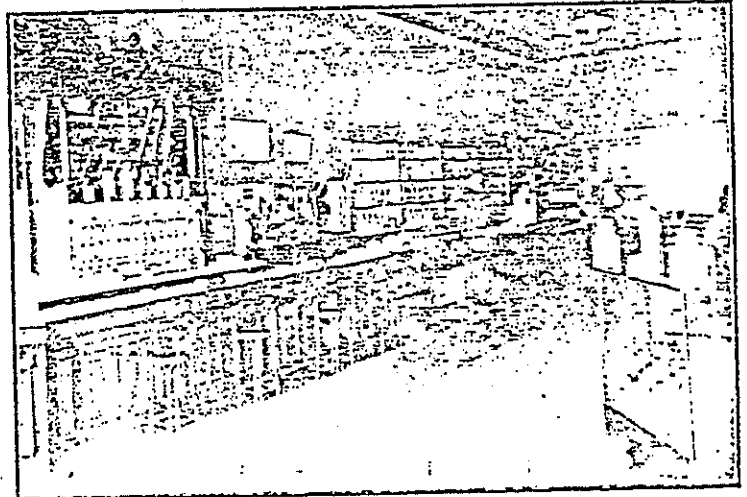
Geo. A. Flippin, M. D.

WILSON BROTHERS

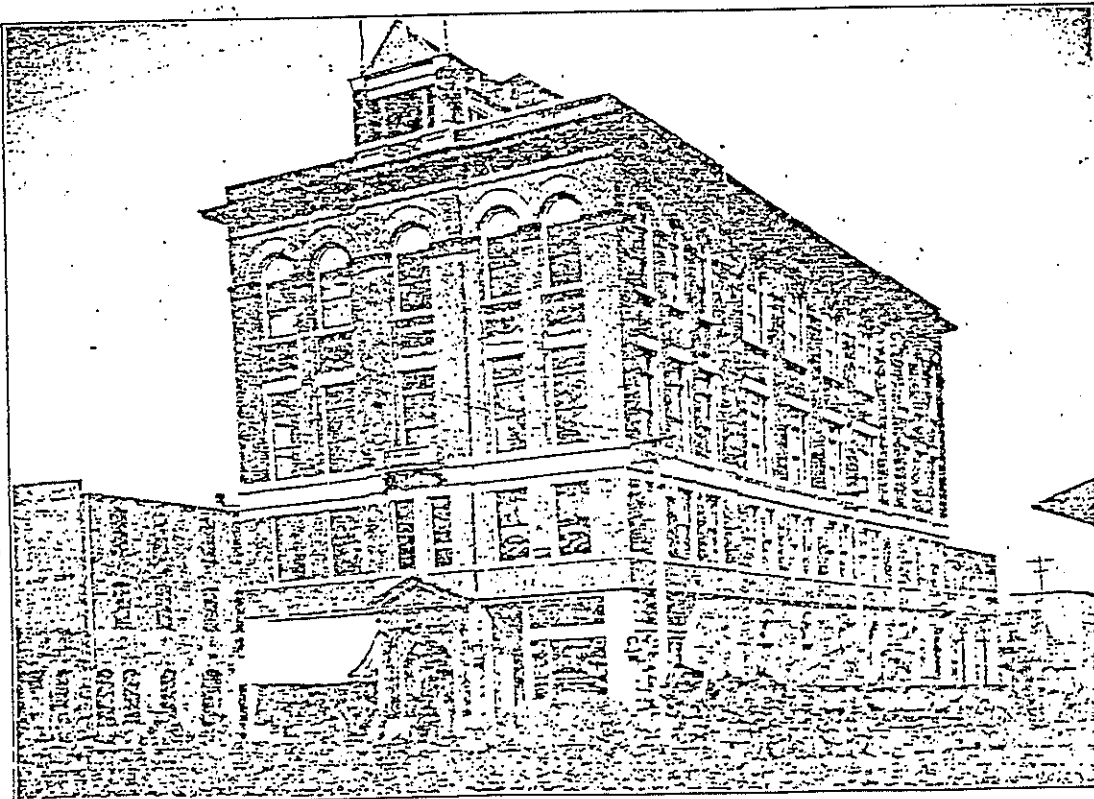
The most popular exclusive colored drug store in the city is that of Wilson Brothers at 322 Main street. This business was started January 1, 1905, with a stock of \$2,000 and during the first year has grown until the demands of their trade necessitate their carrying a stock of \$5,000. The fixtures and interior arrangement present a very inviting appearance and the stock of drugs, patent medicines, toilet articles, stationery, candies, cigars, tobacco, etc., is artistically arranged. They pay particular attention to the prescription de-



partment, and no effort is spared to be precise and prompt in filling prescriptions. The soda fountain is operated summer and winter, and here the trade receives all the best hot and cold drinks. The members composing the firm are John U., Ed. H., and Wiley M. Wilson, all of whom are young colored men well and favorably known. Wiley Wilson was graduated from the Howard University, Washington, D. C., and is a registered pharmacist. The members of this firm are all good mixers among their race, and their business is steadily on the increase.
