The above claim to have priority over any other claim and to be paid from dividends due out of this fund until the entire assumt of the above claim is paid."

tem per cent divident on the deposit to the credit of said Honorary Commission in the sum of Right Hundred Twenty-cix and 3/100 (\$825.02) Dellare, and checks are now drawn and in the hands of the Bank Commissioner, one in the sum of Righty-cight and 72/100 (\$88.79) Dellare, payable to the intervence, and one check in the sum of Seven Hundred Thirty-coven and 22/100 (\$757.22) Dellare, payable to the intervence.

The Court further finds that it was the intention of the Gamp Pike Hamorery Commission, which was the owner of said deposit, to assign to the intervener the sam of Eight Hundred Righty-seven and 96/100 (\$607.96) Dellars, and which sam was to be paid out of dividends declared on said deposit until the full sam of Right Hundred Eighty-seven and 96/100 (\$607.96) Dellars had been paid him in full.



THEREFORE, the Court being well and sufficiently advised, doth hereby order, adjudge and decree that the Deputy Bank Commissioners pay to the intervener herein the sum of Right Bankred Twenty-six and 2/100 (\$686.02) Dellare, which sum is the dividend, payable on the deposit belonging to the Camp Pike Honorury Commission, and that if further dividends are declared on said deposit in the future, that said commissioner shall pay the intervener out of said dividend a further sum of Sixty-one and 94/100 (\$61.94) Dellare.
