

to the State of Arkansas for the use and benefit of the Arkansas National Guard, and that said assignments were delivered to the Deputy Bank Commissioner on the 29th day of February, 1932; that on June 15th, 1932, another assignment to the intervenor, was delivered to said Deputy Bank Commissioner, providing, as follows:

"For value received, same being services rendered as Executive Secretary of the Camp Pike Honorary Commission from August 15, 1931, to December 31, 1931, we hereby transfer, sell and assign to Henry F. Fredeman, Box 173, Little Rock, Arkansas, all our right, title and interest in an amount of Eight Hundred Eighty-seven and 96/100 (\$887.96) Dollars out of a balance of \$8,886.17 shown to our credit on the books of the American Exchange Trust Company, Little Rock, Arkansas.

The above claim to have priority over any other claim and to be paid from dividends due out of this fund until the entire amount of the above claim is paid."

4. There has been declared by said Bank Commissioner a ten per cent dividend on the deposit to the credit of said Honorary Commission in the sum of Eight Hundred Twenty-six and 2/100 (\$826.02) Dollars, and checks are now drawn and in the hands of the Bank Commissioner, one in the sum of Eighty-eight and 72/100 (\$88.72) Dollars, payable to the intervenor, and one check in the sum of Seven Hundred Thirty-seven and 22/100 (\$737.22) Dollars, payable to the State of Arkansas.

The Court further finds that it was the intention of the Camp Pike Honorary Commission, which was the owner of said deposit, to assign to the intervenor the sum of Eight Hundred Eighty-seven and 96/100 (\$887.96) Dollars, and which sum was to be paid out of dividends declared on said deposit until the full sum of Eight Hundred Eighty-seven and 96/100 (\$887.96) Dollars had been paid him in full.

THEFORE, the Court being well and sufficiently advised, doth hereby order, adjudge and decree that the Deputy Bank Commissioner pay to the intervenor herein the sum of Eight Hundred Twenty-six and 2/100 (\$826.02) Dollars, which sum is the dividend, payable on the deposit belonging to the Camp Pike Honorary Commission, and that if further dividends are declared on said deposit in the future, that said commissioner shall pay the intervenor out of said dividend a further sum of Sixty-one and 94/100 (\$61.94) Dollars.

AMERICAN EXCHANGE TRUST COMPANY, Insolvent.

DECREE

On this day, the intervention of H. F. Fredeman coming on to be heard, and the intervenor being present in person and by his solicitors, Dillon & Robinson, and the Deputy State Bank Commissioner in charge of the liquidation of the above insolvent bank, being represented by his solicitor, Nat Hughes, and the State of Arkansas being represented by its Assistant Attorney General, Claude Duty, and this cause being presented to the Court on the intervention with its exhibits, and the testimony of H. F. Fredeman and Morehead Wright on behalf of the intervenor, and Beall Hempstead, together with the original assignments involved herein, on behalf of the Deputy Bank Commissioner, and from all of which the Court finds, that:

1. The intervenor was at all times prior to December 31, 1931, the Executive Secretary of the Camp Pike Honorary Commission, and said Commission was indebted to the intervenor in the sum of Eight Hundred Eighty-seven and 96/100 (\$887.96) Dollars for services rendered.

2. At said time there was on deposit in the American Exchange Trust Company, now insolvent, to the credit of the said Commission, the sum of Eighty-two Hundred Sixty and 21/100 (\$8200.21) Dollars.

3. On February 23, 1932, the said Commission assigned to intervenor all of its right, title and interest in and to the sum of Eight Hundred Eighty-seven and 96/100 (\$887.96) Dollars out of the balance of said deposit, said assignment being designated by said Commission as a preferred claim to said deposit; and that the balance, after the payment of intervenor's claim, was assigned


