1. Pursuant to instructions contained in Executive Order #8530, August 31, 1940; letter, the Secretary of War to the Governor, State of Arkansas, September 5, 1940; file WD 325 (8-31-40) M-6; and letter, the Adjutant General, State of Arkansas, to Commanding Officer, 154th Observation Squadron, September 10, 1940, all active eligibles and elements of this organization, including attached Medical Department Detachment, and all personnel of both the active and inactive National Guard assigned thereto are hereby ordered into the active military service of the United States, effective this date, for a period of twelve consecutive months, unless sooner relieved, or unless said period is extended by Legislative Action.
2. All persons so ordered into the active military service of the United States, or from the effective date of this order, relieved from duty in the National Guard of their respective states for so long as they shall remain in the active military service of the United States, and during such period shall be subject to such laws and regulations for the government of the Army of the United States as may be applicable to members of the Army whose permanent retention in the active service is not contemplated by law.
3. Commissioned officers and warrant officer appointed in the National Guard of the United States and commissioned or holding warrants in the Army of the United States, and effective by this order, are hereby ordered

All officers and warrant officers of the National Guard appointed in the National Guard, federally recognized or examined and found qualified for Federal recognition, and assigned to units ordered to active duty under this order prior to the effective date hereof, who do not hold appointments in the National Guard of the United States and commissions or warrants in the Army of the United States, are hereby tendered such appointments in the same grade and arm or service which they respectfully hold in the National Guard.

Warrant officers and enlisted men of the National Guard who hold appointments as officers in the National Guard of the United States and commissions in the Army of the United States, and are assigned to units ordered to active duty under this order prior to the effective date hereof, are hereby ordered to active duty military service as commissioned officer of the Army of the United States under these appointments and commissions.

EXECUTIVE ORDER

**ORDERING CERTAIN UNITS AND MEMBERS OF THE NATIONAL
GUARD OF THE UNITED STATES INTO THE ACTIVE MILITARY
SERVICE OF THE UNITED STATES.**

By virtue of the authority conferred upon me by Public Resolution No. 96., 76 Congress, approved August 27, 1940, and the National Defense Act of June 3, 1916, as amended (39 Stat. 166), and as Commander-in-Chief of the Army and Navy of the United States, I hereby order into the active military service of the United States, effective September 16, 1940, the following units and members of the National Guard of the United States to serve in the active military service of the United States for a period of twelve consecutive months, unless sooner relieved:

A Brief History of University of Arkansas at Little Rock (UALR) Veterans


Shortly after World War II, many post-war veterans found themselves embarking on the path of pursuing an education. In 1946, the Little Rock Junior College (now UALR) found itself with a new organization on campus. The Junior College Veterans' Organization was formed and began with 143 members. Since then, membership has fluctuated, but the organization (now the UALR Veterans Association) is still active on campus today.

In the fall of 1996, an additional organization called Epsilon Tau Sigma (ETS) was formed when a group of non-traditional students began talking about what they had in common, and formed a national coed veterans' fraternity of like-minded veterans. Since none of them met the criteria of the traditional rites of acceptance into fraternities and sororities, they found that the military was their common bond of socialization.

The ETS fraternity had received recognition at Purdue University in January of 1991. A national board was formed in the spring of 1994, and ETS was nationally recognized later that year. The UALR Chapter of ETS was founded in the fall of 1996 by David Dubois, a former UALR student who was also at the time a member of the UALR Veterans' Association.

For four consecutive years, both veterans' groups have participated in a Veterans Day flag raising ceremony. UALR Chancellor Charles E. Hathaway participated on Veterans Day, 1996 shortly after the ETS group was formed. Both groups became active in community involvement, including participation in the "*Paint Your Heart Out*" Program, and relief efforts to tornado victims in March of 1997. The groups also sponsored Congressional Medal of Honor Recipient Clarence E. Sasser to speak on campus in the fall of 1997, where several members of both groups attended the Medal of Honor Banquet later that evening.

Both groups planned their 1998 spring semester project by assisting the Vietnam Veterans of America, Chapter 184, Little Rock-North Little Rock, AR, with the "Wall that Heals" Vietnam Veterans Moving Wall Tour at Fort Roots in North Little Rock from March 5-8, 1998. Members stood vigil at the "Wall" on March 6, 1998, and other members of the groups assisted in the planning and coordination of the event. The groups participated in the Annual POW-MIA Ceremony, and provided a helping hand during "*Operation Santa Claus*," both held at the Arkansas State Capitol in the fall semesters of 1998 and 1999. They also sponsored Congressional Medal of Honor Recipient Nick Bacon to speak to UALR students on Veterans Day 1998.

Interest was lost in the ETS organization due to problems with the national governing body and organizational structure of the fraternity. A newly formed national fraternity, Phi Chi Sigma (PCS) has been formed on the UALR Campus with many of the former ETS members petitioning for membership into the newly formed fraternity, as well as other former national ETS chapters from around the country. The PCS Fraternity is currently undergoing the legal process for incorporation into a national organization.

The UALR Veterans Association, carrying on the tradition started in 1946, is an organization formed to assist military members in readjusting themselves back into the walk of civilian life. The basis of this group is to provide a means for that adjustment while at the same time providing a camaraderie among its members. Many of the members of the association can answer questions veterans have about academic issues in their schooling, or where to go and what to do in the great State of Arkansas.
