

Guard Units Mobilized Into Camp Robinson December 23 1940

Physical locations & proposed marker info:

Units of 35th "Santa Fe" Division" were composed of Guard units from states of Arkansas, Kansas, Missouri & Nebraska. CG was MG Truman.

Camp Headquarters: Located across from Rock House Service Club; bldg is gone & steps are now buried under north edge of parking lot.

Stockade: Located just north of PEC complex in parking lot where OMS-7 & 9 shops are now & bordered roughly by 2nd & 3rd Sts. Also was WWII location of 2 Regiments of 92 Inf Division (Colored Troops); the area is now site of PEC (See maps 1941/1943). In 1943, stockade was at the current location of Pike House (identified as "prison camp" on map).

Reception Center: Located between Phillips Armory & Armed Forces Reserve Center complex & bounded by Arkansas & South Dakota Avenues.

Base Hospital: At southwest corner of Camp JTR & south of Air Field; accessible by foot, vehicle entrance is blocked by earthen obstacles.

C.A.S.C.: refers to "Corps Area Service Command" ?, pre-WWII name

35th Division HQ: Ruins include a rock wall, drive, walks & flagstaff base. Located northeast of 22nd St & Nebraska Ave intersection.

Now 69th SIB, KS ARNG of 35th "Santa Fe" Division.

153rd Infantry Regiment: North of Missouri east of 14th St near Battle Skills & west of Recruiting/Retention office.

Units from Arkansas towns of Conway, Little Rock, North Little Rock, Pine Bluff, Searcy, Hot Springs, Hope, Magnolia, Prescott, Dardanelle, Clarksville, Arkadelphia, Blytheville, Beebe, Batesville, Forrest City & Walnut Ridge. They were mobilized to home stations December 23, 1940 & moved to Camp Robinson Jan 1941. Have "pre-bear" insignia

43rd Combat Engineer Battalion: bounded by 8th & 10th Sts, Arkansas & South Dakota Ave's & just north of Ammunition Storage Area
Current status: huh? **need insig**

110th Engineer Regiment: bounded by Arkansas & Minnesota Ave's, 16th & 17th Sts; **need insig**
Status: 1942, 1st Bn redesignated 110 Engineer Battalion & 2nd Bn was redesignated 2nd Bn, 132 Engineer Regiment. Was a Missouri Guard unit.

110th Quartermaster Regiment: bounded by Arkansas & Minnesota Ave's, 14th & 16th Sts; **need insig**
Status: Partly disbanded 1942, most redesignated 110 QM BN (Nebraska)

110th Medical Regiment: bounded by Arkansas & Minnesota Ave's, 11th & 13th Sts & west of Ammunition Storage Area; **need insig**

Had 2 Replacement Training Centers, Branch Immaterial & Medical. There were 5 War Department theaters, 1 theater for colored troops, an arena with bleachers for 10,000 people, field house where 3 basketball games could be played at once, 17 chapels for worship, an olympic-size swimming pool, telegraph office, post office, 2 main PX's & at least 21 company PX's. There were about 60,000 individual's on post always & over 850,000 soldiers went through Camp Robinson.

Camp HQ was across from current "Rock House" & in 8th Service Command. Current PX (Canteen) was bath house & swimming pool. **have patch**
