Records of Volunteer Union Soldiers Who Served During the Civil War (Record Group 94)

President Lincoln's proclamation in April 1861 called for 75,000 militiamen from the loyal States and Territories to suppress the rebellion in the Southern States. Subsequent proclamations and acts of Congress provided for additional increases in the size of the regular army and navy and called for additional volunteers and militiamen. The States and Territories met the requirements through activating the militia, voluntary enlistments, and the draft.

During the first 2 years of the war, many units were mustered for short periods (30, 60, and 90 days and 6, 9, and 12 months), but normal enlistments were for 1 to 3 years. Most soldiers served from units formed within their neighborhoods or States or Territories of residence.

A reenlisting soldier was not necessarily assigned to the same unit in which he had previously served, or even to the same branch of service, or arm of service. Disabled soldiers still capable of performing a service were assigned to the Veteran Reserve Corps (VRC).

Many units upon organization adopted or used a unique name, generally the name by which the unit had been known as a militia unit. When a unit was mustered into the Union army, the name was changed to conform with regulations of the Union Army. A unit designation usually consisted of a number, the State or Territory name, and the arm of service: for example, 1st Iowa Cavalry. Some unit designations included the name of the officer who formed the company, or its commanding officer. Some units had two or more successive designations: for example, 1st Pennsylvania Cavalry and 44th Pennsylvania Volunteers. State and Territory names were not used for units composed of soldiers from several States or Territories or for special units. Records are generally filed under the final designation for a particular unit.

There are compiled military service records for nearly all soldiers who were accepted for service in the Union army as militiamen or volunteers, 1861–65, whether or not they actually served. Records relating to soldiers who participated in actions that occurred between 1861 and 1865 are included in the records of the Civil War, even if the actions, such as Indian warfare, were unrelated to the war. The compiled military service records for Civil War soldiers are similar to those for other periods of service.

Records of enlisted men sometimes include information about age, residence at the time of enlistment. occupations at the time of enlistment, and physical description. Personal papers occasionally give additional information about residence, family, or business of officers and enlisted men. Information about heirs is sometimes found in records of hospitalization or death in service. The records generally refer to Federal service in other units during, before, and after the Civil War.

No general comprehensive name index to the compiled service records for Union army volunteer soldiers exists. Separate indexes are available for each State and Territory except South Carolina, which furnished no white troops to the Union army.

To locate the record of service of a particular soldier, the researcher may need to consult several indexes. A soldier may have enlisted in or been assigned to a unit from a different State or Territory from the one the researcher expects, or to a special unit composed of persons from several different areas. For example, a soldier from Tennessee might be in a unit from Kentucky.

Requests for Records

Inquiries about compiled military service records should be submitted on NATF Form 80, "Order for Copies of Veterans Records." Instructions for its use and an explanation of how orders are processed are printed on the form. When a military service file is found, documents that normally contain the basic information about the veteran will be selected and photocopied. Photocopies of the reproducible papers in the file can be furnished for a moderate cost per page.

Records of Movements and Activities of Volunteer Union Organizations (Record Groups 94 and 407)

Beginning in 1890, the War Department compiled histories of the volunteer military organizations that served during the Civil War. The compiled records for each organization are in jacket-envelopes bearing the title "Record of Events" and giving the name of the unit. Many of the envelopes contain abstracts of the information found in the record-of-events section of the original muster rolls and returns. Also included are some cards showing the exact captions of the muster-in and muster-out rolls and the certifications by the mustering officers verifying the accuracy of the rolls. The jacket-envelopes for a few units contain no documents but only references to other units with which these units were merged.

Compiled service histories contain no information about individual soldiers. The abstracts instead relate to the stations, movements, or activities of each unit or part of it. Frequently there is information about the unit's organization or composition, strength and losses, and disbandment. Sometimes the cards also show the names of commanding officers, the dates the unit was called into service and mustered out, the terms of service, and similar information.

Compiled Records Showing Service of Military Units in Volunteer Union Organizations. M594. 225 rolls. DP.

This microfilm publication reproduces the compiled records that give histories of military units in volunteer Union organizations. Most of the records are arranged alphabetically by State or Territory, thereunder by type of unit (cavalry, artillery, or infantry), followed by militia, reserve, sharpshooter, and other organizations. Whenever possible, the units are arranged numerically within each type, for example, the 1st Cavalry, 1st Veteran Cavalry, 1st Mounted Rifles, and 2d Cavalry of New York.

The records for units from States and Territories are followed by the records of units that were not limited to any one State or Territory, such as the U.S. Colored Troops, U.S. Volunteers, and U.S. Veteran Reserve Corps.

Records of Confederate Soldiers Who Served During the Civil War (Record Group 109)

In April 1865, during the final days of the Civil War, as the Confederate Government evacuated Richmond. its archives were shipped south, burned, or abandoned. Some of the military records passed into the hands of Union Army officers and were sent to the War Department in Washington. There the Adjutant General in July 1865 established a bureau in his office for the "collection, safekeeping, and publication of Rebel Archives." In 1903 the Secretary of War persuaded the Governors of most Southern States to lend the War Department the Confederate military personnel records in their possession for copying.

These captured and copied Confederate records, as well as Union prison and parole records, were abstracted by the War Department between 1903 and 1927 to compile military service records of Confederate officers, noncommissioned officers, and enlisted men. NARA, however, does not have any Confederate pension files, which are State, not Federal, records. For information on Confederate pensions, contact the Museum of the Confederacy, 1201 East Clay Street, Richmond, VA 23219.

The following microfilm publications reproduce indexes and compiled military service records of Confederate soldiers. Table 3 lists the corresponding publication numbers. The first publication described is a consolidated name index to all compiled service records of Confederate soldiers. Specific State and organizational indexes follow. Each index card gives the name of a soldier, his rank, the unit in which he served, and often a statement concerning the origin or background of that unit. There are cross-reference cards for names that appear in the records under more than one spelling.

Compiled service records for Confederate soldiers are arranged by State or Territory, and thereunder according to organizational breakdowns ending with either the regiment or independent battalion or company. Under each unit the service records are arranged alphabetically by surname.

fied with any one State. Two or three of these organizations seem to have been originally considered units of the Confederate Regular Army. Several others were raised among residents of Indian Territory; one was made up of foreigners recruited among Union prisoners of war.

Preceding the jacket-envelopes for the individual soldiers in each organizational unit, there are usually empty envelopes on which the officers of the unit are listed. Jacket-envelopes contain cards showing the exact captions of muster-in and muster-out rolls that were copied and the certifications of the mustering officers verifying the accuracy of the rolls. Record-of-events cards indicate the activities in which any part of the unit had been engaged. Because of the irregular way in which most of these units were organized, there are relatively few caption cards. Record-of-events cards are more numerous, but they sometimes do not contain any account of happenings because no such notation was made in the original records.

Records of Confederate Movements and Activities (Record Group 109)

Beginning in 1903, the War Department compiled abstract histories of the movements and activities of Confederate military units. Original muster rolls and returns were the principal sources of information on the caption cards and the envelopes that list officers. Rosters, payrolls, hospital registers, casualty lists, Union prison registers and rolls, parole rolls, and inspection reports were also abstracted.

Compiled Records Showing Service of Military Units in Confederate Organizations. M861. 74 rolls. DP.

This microfilm publication reproduces the compiled records of Confederate military units. Because many Confederate Army records were lost or destroyed by the end of the war, the compiled military histories of most units are incomplete.

Most of the records are arranged alphabetically by State, thereunder by type of unit (cavalry, artillery, or infantry), followed by reserve, militia, local defense, conscript, prison guard, instruction, or other organizations. The arrangement of compiled records for units raised directly or otherwise by the Confederate Government is similar except that the latter units are not broken down by State. Numbered units are listed first, followed alphabetically by the named units.

There are no record-of-events cards for a small number of State units that were mustered into Confederate service or for militia units that were never mustered into service. Lists of officers were prepared for many State militia units that were not mustered into service and for other organizations for which no rolls were found. These lists, which are filed under "Miscellaneous," appear at the end of records of State units and at the end of records of units raised directly by the Confederate Government. With a few exceptions, no lists were prepared for units from North Carolina.

An entry in this index shows the name of a veteran; the name and class of dependent, if any; service data; the application number; and, for an approved claim, the pension certificate number and the State from which the claim was made.

For pension application files concerning men who were disabled or killed in Indian wars and in whose behalf no service claims were made, see the records in the "Old Wars" series. For pension applications relating to persons who served in Indian campaigns during the War of 1812, Mexican War, or Civil War, see the pension indexes relating to claims based on service in those wars.

The index cards reproduced on this microfilm publication refer to pension applications of veterans who served in the U.S. Army between 1861 and 1917. The majority of the records pertain to Civil War veterans, but they also include veterans of the Spanish-American War, the Philippine Insurrection, Indian wars, and World War I.

The information provided here is virtually the same as that in the General Index to Pension Files, 1861-1934, T288. Unlike the alphabetical General Index, however, this index groups the applicants according to the units in which they served. The cards are arranged alphabetically by State, thereunder by arm of service (infantry, cavalry, artillery), thereunder numerically by regiment, and thereunder alphabetically by veteran's surname.

Each card gives the soldier's name, rank, unit, and terms of service; names of relationships of any dependents; the application number; the certificate number; and the State from which the claim was filed.
