a. Exterior: There have been virtually no alterations to the National Guard Armory and it is in good condition. At some point, however, a window on the eastern elevation was altered for use as a side door.

b. Interior: Unknown

9. Significant features:

Its T-plan consists of a head house, or administrative wing, attached to a drill hall. The head house forms the cross arm of the T. The castellated parapet, four rows of recessed brick that emphasize the front door and decorative buttresses along the walls provide the only relief from the south, east, and west elevations.

- 12. History of Property:

The National Guard Armory was the first permanent building to be constructed in Jefferson County for the sole use and benefit of a local militia company. The property on which it sits was donated to the Arkansas National Guard through the patriotism of John J. and Mary Holland Craig.

Seeking a means of arms and equipment storage requiring fewer rental contracts, the Arkansas General Assembly first appropriated funds for an armory building program in 1926. To a lesser extent, the program continues today.

On January 14, 1974, the armory was inactivated and all property sold to Ten-Ark, Inc., for \$25,101.00.
