Significance of the Assumption of Command Ceremony

The assumption of command ceremony is a tradition which formally restates to the Soldiers and Airmen of the command the continuity of the authority of the commander. The ceremony holds special significance in that it serves as a welcome to the incoming commander. It is a formal ritual conducted before the assembled members of the command.

The Arkansas National Guard assumption of command is the official ceremony denoting the transfer of command responsibility to the incoming adjutant general. This action is symbolized in the ceremonial passing of the Arkansas National Guard colors.

The colors are first passed from the state command sergeant major, who serves as the adjutant general's senior enlisted advisor, to the governor, who is the commander-in-chief of the Arkansas National Guard.

The governor then passes the colors, along with the responsibility for the Arkansas National Guard mission and the welfare

of the members of the Guard, to the incoming adjutant general.

From the incoming commander's hands, the colors are returned to the state command sergeant major, marking the beginning of the new commander's leadership.

Major General William D. Wofford

Major General Wofford was born on August 7, 1949, in Clarksville, Ark. He graduated from Subiaco Academy, in Subiaco, Ark., in 1967, and received a Bachelor's degree in Mathematics from Arkansas Tech University in 1971.

General Wofford began his military career when he was commissioned a second lieutenant in Field Artillery, upon graduation from the Reserve Officer Training Corps program May 15, 1971. After completing the Field Artillery School at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, General Wofford served on active duty with the 82nd Airborne Division and the 1st Armored Division until he returned to Arkansas and joined the Arkansas Army National Guard in December 1975.

General Wofford has served in several command positions, including 5th Battalion, 206th Field Artillery and brigade-level command of 87th Troop Command. During Operation Desert Storm, he served as the commander of the 2nd Battalion, 142d Field Artillery. He later served on The Adjutant General's staff as the Plans, Operations and Training Officer, as Chief of Staff for the Arkansas Army National Guard, and as the Deputy Commander, State Area Command, Arkansas Army National Guard. On April 28, 2005, he received federal recognition as a Major General of the Line.

General Wofford has received numerous awards and decorations including the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star Medal, and the Meritorius Service Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters.

General Wofford's military education includes: Field Artillery Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, Command and General Staff Officers Course, and the U.S. Army War College.

General Wofford lives in Conway, Ark., with his wife, the former Jan Hutcherson of Russellville. They have 2 children, William and Stephen.
