

TO MEMBERS OF THE 39TH INFANTRY BRIGADE

Since its beginning on 6 Dec 67, the 39th Inf Bde (Sep) has evolved into a force that is well prepared for any peacetime or wartime mission. Its history is long and varied, beginning with its association with the 101st Airborne. For many years, annual training meant going to Ft. Chaffee and spending the first week in the barracks, the middle weekend off, and then conducting a brigade-level three-day field training exercise.

In 1976, with the Vietnamese refugees, and again in 1980 when the Cubans occupied the barracks, the 39th spent its annual training entirely in the field. Throughout the 1980s and early 1990s, the infantry battalions and the artillery battalion had rotations to Panama and Honduras. Infantry battalions also sent companies to Great Britain and Germany for training while like units from these countries trained with the 39th at Ft. Chaffee. In 1986, the 39th conducted annual training at Ft. Bragg and followed that with the 1987 annual training at Ft. Campbell. Both of these ATs were total movements of the Bde by rail, air, and convoy.

In 1989, the 2-153 Inf was one of the first National Guard battalions to do a Joint Readiness Training Center (JRTC) rotation at Ft. Chaffee. JRTC is the Army's premier light infantry combat training center.

The pace accelerated when the 39th was designated one of fifteen enhanced Separate Brigades on 7 Jan 95. The enhanced status means that the brigade is better resources to act as a strategic reserve, in the event of two nearly simultaneous theater wars. After JRTC had moved to Ft. Polk, the 39th participated in 1996. Light enhanced brigades go to JRTC every seventh year.

On 5 Jun 99, the 7th Inf Div was re-activated at Ft Carson, Colorado, comprised of an active duty headquarters and three enhanced separate brigades – the 39th, the 41st Bde from Oregon, and the 45th Bde from Oklahoma. The 7th Div is the only light integrated division in the Army.

Since becoming part of the 7th Div, the 39th Bde has had more deployments that any National Guard brigade during the period from 1999 to 2002. In June, 1999, Bravo Company, 2-153 Inf deployed to Kuwait, while Bravo Company, 3-153 deployed to Saudi Arabia as part of Operation Southern Watch. They were followed by Charlie Company, 1-153 Inf, which deployed to Kuwait in October, 1999. All three companies provided security for Patriot missiles. In March, 2001, the Delta companies of both 1-153 Inf and 3-153 Inf deployed to Bosnia as part of Security Force Nine.

Then, the events of 11 Sep 01 really changed things. Individual soldiers were placed on State Duty to provide security at airports, the Camden Industrial complex, and Arkansas Nuclear One. On 8 Oct 01, 2-153 Inf, augmented by engineers from the 239th Engr Co, military police from Bde HHC, and some individuals from other units, mobilized. They later deployed to the Sinai as part of the first pure National Guard Task Force to participate as part of the Multinational Force and Observer mission.


The 39th has continued to provide needed personnel, equipment, and services when state or local disasters occur. The brigade's responses to the tornadoes of March 1999 and ice storms of December, 2000 and January 2001 are examples of how the 39th Bde is an asset to the state.

The 39th is truly an enhanced brigade. It is not the designation that makes it enhanced. The quality of our soldiers is what enhances the 39th Bde, and I am proud to command one of the premier fighting forces of the United States, on this occasion of 35 years of service to state and nation.

The 39th will continue to improve its overall readiness. When needed, the 39th will respond, in peace or war.




















The 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) traces its lineage back to World War I when Congress passed an act providing for the enrollment of all male citizens between the ages of twenty-one and thirty-one years, inclusive. This was done in order that volunteers would not have to be relied upon to serve overseas. This act known as the Selective Service Law went into effect on May 19, 1917. On June 5, 1917, Arkansas registered 149, 627 of her citizens for a one hundred percent registration. Of these 51, 858 were inducted into the service of the United States under the Selective Service Law, not including 10,000 who were ready to report to training camps at the time of the Armistice. In addition to these men, three regiments of the Arkansas National Guard were drafted into the service as units.

The Thirty-ninth Division Headquarters was constituted on 18 July 1917 in the National Guard as Headquarters, 39th Division (to be organized with troops from Arkansas, Louisiana, and Mississippi. The 39th Division was organized 25 August 1917 at Camp Beauregard, Louisiana, and 18 July 1917. The First Arkansas Infantry became the 153d Regiment in the National Army; The Second Arkansas Infantry became the 142d Field Artillery, and the Third Arkansas Infantry formed the basis of the 154th Infantry and 141st Machine Gun Battalion. These regiments were all attached to the Thirty-ninth Division in September 1917. The three regiments of the Arkansas National Guard drafted into the service as units contained 110 officers and 6, 315 enlisted men. The first unit of the division arrived in France on 12 August 1918, and the lost on 12 September 1918. It was then sent to the St. Florent area, southwest of

Bourges, where it was designated as a replacement division. The 39th Division returned to the United States in December 1918. During service it was commanded by Major General Henry C. Hodges, the assigned commander, and Brigadier General Ira A. Haynes, temporary commander. One of the original units, the 114th Sanitary Trains, advanced into Germany. The 39th Division was demobilized 23 January 1919 at Camp Beauregard, Louisiana.

The years between World War I and World War II the 153d Infantry Regiment and the 142d Field Artillery Regiment returned to state control as National Guard Units. In 1923 the 206th Coast Artillery, Anti-Aircraft Regiment was organized, federal recognition was extended by the War Department on 24 November 1923. Colonel Elgan C. Robertson was promoted from a Lieutenant Colonel of the 153d Infantry and assigned to command the 206th Regiment on 24 November 1923. The Machine Gun Battalion of the Regiment was composed of officers and men of the 141st Machine Bun Battalion, which was transferred to the Regiment. Most of the officers and men of the Regiment had served in the 153d Infantry during both the Mexican Border Campaign and World War 1. Colonel Robertson commanded the First Battalion 142d Field Artillery during World War I.

The 153d Infantry Regiment and the 206th Coast Artillery regiment were ordered to active duty service on 23 December 1940 and 6 January 1941 respectively. Both units eventually were deployed and stationed in the Aleutian Islands of Alaska. The 153d Regiment deployed the 1st and 3rd Battalions on 1 September 1941. The 2nd Battalion arrived in February 1943. The 206th

Regiment arrived at Dutch Harbor on 16 August 1941. Approximately at 0600 hours on 3 June 1942, Japanese Forces attacked Dutch Harbor, which marked the first time that North America had come under an aerial bombardment. Members of the 206th Regiment distinguished themselves during this attack and a subsequent attack that occurred 36 hours later by providing antiaircraft fire with their 3-inch anti-aircraft guns and .50 caliber machineguns. Fortythree soldiers were killed and fifty wounded of this number the 206th Regiment lost seven killed in action and nine wounded.

After the attacks the Japanese invaded two islands at the end of the Aleutian Island chain because Dutch Harbor was more heavily defended than previously thought. On 11 May 1943, the 7th Infantry Division attacked the island of Attu. This attack was second only to the Iwo Jima in terms of number of combatants in the Pacific Theater. Several individual members of the 153d and 206th Regiments participated in the 7th Infantry Division attacks. The Aleutian Campaign has been termed the "Forgotten War". However, our heritage will never let us forget.

The 153d Infantry Regiment returned to Camp Shelby, Mississippi and was inactivated 30 June 1944. Most of the members of the regiment were assigned as cadre to Camp Robinson, Arkansas, Camp Maxey, Texas, and Fort Hood, Texas. The remaining men were sent overseas as replacements to fight in the European campaigns. The 206th Field Artillery Regiment also returned from Alaska and was later deployed to Europe in 1944.

The 39th Infantry Division was reconstituted 27 May 1946 in the National

Guard as Headquarters, 39th Infantry Division. The headquarters was reorganized and federally recognized in part on 30 September 1946 at New Orleans, Louisiana, and in part 26 August 1947 at Little Rock, Arkansas. The 39th Division was designated as the "Delta Division".

Following World War II the 39th Infantry Division was poorly equipped and had reduced manning levels and limited training programs. The major highlight during this period was when division troops from Arkansas were federally activated from 24 September 1957 to 24 October 1957 for the integration of Little Rock Central High School.

On 1 December 1967 the 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) was organized from units left by the deactivation of the 39th Infantry Division. The new brigade was organized under 93% manning levels and was organized under a modified table of organization and equipment. The new brigade was comprised of a Brigade Headquarters and Headquarters Company, an Armored Cavalry Troop, an Engineer Company, a Support Battalion, three Infantry Battalions, and a light towed Field Artillery Battalion. Colonel Dan Walker was assigned as Commander of the 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) and promoted to Brigadier General effective December 1, 1967.

During 1967 and 1968 intensive smallunit training exercises designed to mold the newly reorganized units into competent and confident infantry teams were initiated. Special training allowances for extra drill were made resulting in the brigade achieving superior ratings earlier than projected. Dedication, desire and intense personal

effort blended with skilled leadership made this training effective.

In 1970 a special tradition was adopted when Brigadier General Dan Walker was presented the first "Bowie Knife" by James Lile a renowned knife maker from Russellville, Arkansas. These "Bowie Knives" were designed solely for the 39th Brigade to represent the Bowie knife shown on the Brigade insignia patch. The concept of the Bowie knife evolved from the knife designed by famous frontiersman James "Jim" Bowie at Washington Post, Arkansas, and was adopted by the Brigade as part of their insignia. The knives are a registered edition and are made special order for the commander's presentation. Designed to be worn in uniform, the knives have ivory handles for general officers, stag handles for colonels, ebony handles for lieutenant colonels and majors, cherry for warrant officers and rosewood for sergeant majors. To date there have been over 470 knives presented to field grade officers, warrant officer, sergeant majors who have served as members of the 39th Brigade and other Army personnel.

On December 6, 1971 Brigadier General Dan Walker retired from the Army National Guard and Brigadier General Joseph R. Chappell, Jr. was appointed Commanding General, 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate).

In 1972 Headquarters, and Headquarters Detachment, 39th Support Battalion won the Hulen Trophy for marksmanship.

On 1 November 1973 Brigadier General Joseph R. Chappell, Jr. is appointed as The Adjutant General of the Arkansas National Guard by the Governor. Colonel Harold L. Gwatney was promoted to Brigadier General and assigned as Commander, 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate).

During 1974 2nd Battalion 153d Infantry took part in an air deployment of troops from Fort Chaffee, Arkansas to Camp Robinson, Arkansas by C-130 Aircraft to meet an aggressor force from the 101st Airborne (Air Assault) Division in a field training exercise, then redeployed by air back to Fort Chaffee to conclude Annual Training.

During the 1975 Annual Training period, the 39th Support Battalion supplied and re-supplied the 5-206th Field Artillery Battalion over a distance of 20 miles for two weeks by 100% use of air drops. This accomplishment was a first for a reserve component support unit. The 3rd Battalion 153d Infantry was selected and conducted special training at Fort Benning, Georgia during the 1975 Annual Training period.

In 1976 The 2nd Battalion 153d Infantry received the Reckford Award for the outstanding battalion of Readiness Region 7. The 1st Battalion 153d Infantry was selected for specialized training at Fort Benning, Georgia to be conducted during Annual Training period 1976. Colonel Colin L. Powell, Commander, 2nd Brigade, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) was the Chief Evaluator for the 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) during Annual Training 1976. Colonel Powell was presented with a 39th Brigade "Bowie Knife" for his outstanding support to the Brigade. Colonel Powell later became General of the Army and served as the, National Security Advisor to the President during President Ronald Reagan's administration, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staffs under Presidents George Bush and President Bill Clinton. General Powell presently serves as the Secretary of State of the United States of

America under President George W. Bush.

The brigade celebrates its 10th Anniversary on December 1, 1977.

Colonel John B. Webb, Jr. was assigned Brigade Commander, 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) on March 1, 1978 and federally recognized as Brigadier General, Line, on August 28, 1978.

The 1980 Annual Training was dubbed the Cuban Refugees - "HOT CAMP". The brigade went to the field for two weeks due to Cuban refugees that were housed at Fort Chaffee pending relocation in the United States. Every day the Brigade was at Fort Chaffee, the temperature was over 100 degrees Fahrenheit. Elements of the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) from Fort Campbell, Kentucky trained with and supported brigade units in the conduct of individual and unit training programs. These programs provided commanders; staffs and troops valuable experience in conducting simulated combat operations. The brigade offered GED classes to all personnel desiring a high school equivalency diploma while completing its first annual training period with 15 days in a field environment. Co B, 2-153d Infantry was rated the top infantry company during annual training.

Other events during 1980 included the National Guard Bureau accelerated implementation of unit level nuclear, biological and chemical positions in the brigade's Modified Table of Organization and Equipment (MTOE). A new armory was completed at Marianna along with an organizational maintenance shop (OMS) for Service Battery, 5-206th Field Artillery.

Events in 1981 include Brigadier General Oliver W. "Dub" Myers being named Commander, 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate).

Company A, 2nd Battalion 153d
Infantry (Walnut Ridge and Piggott) was selected to go to Great Britain to train with the Royal Welsh Fusilers for annual training. They were deployed to Stanford England and trained with the 4th (Vol) Battalion, Parachute Regiment in exercise "Volunteer Warrior/Hard Charger". In return, the United Kingdom deployed its Third Royal Welsh Fusilers from Wales, to train with 2nd Battalion at Fort Chaffee.

In 1982 Troop E, 151st Cavalry, was selected to receive the Draper Award, symbolic of the top Armor unit in Army readiness and Mobilization, Region VIII. In October 1982 members of the brigade traveled to Fort McClellan, Alabama to participate in the U.S. Army Chemical School. Units of the 39th Support Battalion, 5-206th Field Artillery Battalion, 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Battalions 153d Infantry and the 439th Signal Platoon underwent unit reorganizations in 1982.

During 1983 Troop E, 151st Cavalry, was again selected to receive the Draper Award. This marked the first time in the 60 year history of the award that one unit was selected for the award two years in succession. Members of the brigade participated in an administrative and logistics staff training exercise "Rockstone I". New equipment was received under the equipment modernization plan. Training began in air deployment (Diamond Bowie II) to prepare for a larger movement and to enhance mobilization readiness.

Brigadier General James A. Ryan assumed command of the 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) in July 1984.

In 1984 the brigade participated in Ozark Dawn II, a joint exercise with units

of the Air Force, Air Force Reserve, Air National Guard and the Marine Reserves. It marked the first time a National Guard unit was airlifted under mobilization conditions from home stations to annual training. Also during 1984 the 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) received an augmentation of air weather personnel, the 154th Air Weather Flight. The brigade continued to train in air deployment at Fort Chaffee and continued to receive new equipment under the equipment modernization plan.

Company B, 3rd Battalion 153d Infantry was selected to attend winter training at Fort McCoy, Wisconsin in February 1985. 2nd Battalion 153d Infantry was deployed to Fort Bragg, North Carolina by military aircraft and practiced air dropping equipment during annual training 1985. The 39th Support Battalion was reorganized under a new MTOE in September 1985.

181 members of Company B, 1st Battalion 153d Infantry conducted annual training in Honduras during April 1986.

The brigade participated in command post exercise "Saber Dragon" with the XVIII Airborne Corps. This allowed the brigade to develop a relationship with the XVIII Airborne Corps and conduct plans for one of the largest deployments undertaken by an Army National Guard unit

Brigadier General James A. "Jack" Ryan was appointed by the Governor of Arkansas as the Adjutant General of Arkansas on July 9, 1986 and promoted to Major General.

Brigadier General Melvin C. Thrash was named commander of the 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) and federally recognized as Brigadier General, Line on 9 July 1986. Also during July 1986, the brigade began deployment to Fort Bragg, North Carolina via wheel, rail, and air transportation, in an effort to test its ability to deploy by all means available upon mobilization. This exercise involved deployment from home stations directly to the field-training site at Fort Bragg, the conduct of combat operations and redeployment to home stations.

Troop E, 151st Cavalry and 39th
Brigade Headquarters and Headquarters
Company were reorganized under a new
MTOE in September 1986. The brigade
received its first issue of office automation
equipment under the Army Reserve
Component Automation System Project.

For annual training 1987 the brigade deployed by air and wheel transportation to Fort Campbell, Kentucky.

Soldiers of the brigade participated in a mobilization exercise at Fort Chaffee and again traveled to Fort Bragg, North Carolina to hone its staff skills in command post exercise "Saber Dragon II" with the XVIII Airborne Corps.

During 1987 the 1st, 2nd, 3rd Battalions 153d Infantry underwent MTOE reorganizations which authorized the formation of the personnel administration center (PAC) at battalion level. Major new equipment fielding were accomplished when Troop E, 151st Cavalry received the M60A3 and select units of the brigade received the High Mobility Multipurpose Wheel Vehicle (HMMV) under the equipment modernization plan.

The brigade celebrated its Twentieth Anniversary in December 1987

The brigade deployed to annual training at Fort Chaffee and hosted a unit from the 5th Light Infantry English Citizen Soldiers during 1988. Two batteries of the 5-206th Field Artillery

Battalion deployed to Honduras for annual training.

As part of the National Guard Unit Exchange Program members of Companies B and C, 2nd Battalion 153d Infantry combined for a deployment by C-141 aircraft to the United Kingdom. Operation "Glo Worm/Rattlesnake" which was conducted at Camp Crickhowell, Wales hosted by members of the 5th Light Infantry English Citizen Soldiers.

In 1989 The brigade served as the verification unit for the Battle Projection Center at Fort Sam Houston while preparing a task force for training at the Joint Readiness Training Center at Fort Chaffee, Arkansas. This training was to prepare the brigade for operations in a low and medium intensity conflict. 2nd Battalion 153d Infantry was the first Arkansas Army National Guard unit to train at the Joint Readiness Training Center (JRTC) at Fort Chaffee, Arkansas. The highlight of the rotation was a visit by the Chairman, Joint Chiefs of Staff, General Colin L. Powell.

In September 1989 all battalions and separate units of the 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) are reorganized under the L series MTOE.

The Army CAPSTONE alignment for the 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) is changed from XVIII Corps to the 9th Infantry Division located at Fort Lewis, Washington.

Company C, 2nd Battalion 153d Infantry conducted their annual training 1989 at Camp Gruber, Oklahoma with its training focus on Military Operations in Urban Terrain (MOUT).

Brigadier General Wesley V. Jacobs assumed command of the 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) in June 1990. Company A, 1st Battalion 153d Infantry, Company C, 3rd Battalion 153d Infantry and Batteries A, B, C, 5th Battalion 206th Field Artillery deployed to and conducted annual training in Honduras as part of the National Guard Bureau's Overseas Deployment Training Program. Company C, 1st Battalion 153d Infantry trained in the United Kingdom.

Companies A, B, and C 2nd Battalion 153d Infantry rotated through deployments to Camp Gruber, Oklahoma for Military Operations in Urban Terrain (MOUT) training. The brigade staff participated in command post exercise "Saber Norse" at Fort Lewis, Washington.

In April 1991 1st Battalion 153d Infantry deployed with selected members from 2nd Battalion 153d Infantry on a SOUTHCOM rotation to the Jungle Operations Training Center (JOTC) at Fort Sherman, Panama.

3rd Battalion 153d Infantry and the remainder of 2nd Battalion 153d Infantry served as Opposing Forces (OPFOR) at the Joint Readiness Training Center, being augmented to the 509th Airborne at Fort Chaffee.

Companies A, B, and C 2nd Battalion 153d Infantry deploy to Joint Task Force Bravo, Honduras in three separate rotations during 1992 for their annual training.

Companies A and B 1st Battalion 153d Infantry conduct annual training at the Battle Skills Training Course at Camp Robinson, Arkansas.

The brigade celebrated its Twenty-Fifth Anniversary in December 1992. A special "Silver Anniversary Brigade Coin" is made.

The brigade conducts annual training 1993 at Fort Chaffee, Arkansas instituting "Lanes Training" under the 5th Army

concept of multi-echelon training. The training emphasis was on squad/platoon attacks and ambushes. Members of the brigade and battalion staffs attended a Mechanized and Armor Introduction Seminar at Fort Knox, Kentucky to become familiar with armor and mechanized tactics. At the time the 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) was scheduled to reorganize as a mechanized infantry brigade.

Members of the brigade and battalion staffs attended a Leaders Training Program (LTP) at the National Training Center (NTC) at Fort Irwin, California in preparation for the scheduled reorganization to a mechanized infantry brigade.

The brigade attends annual training 1994 at Fort Chaffee. Brigade units continue to refine the Lanes Training process of multi-echelon training at the platoon/company levels.

The brigade receives notice that it will not convert to a mechanized infantry brigade and it had been selected for the 1996 National Guard rotation at the Joint Readiness Training Center at Fort Polk, Louisiana.

Brigadier General Wesley V. Jacobs retires from the Arkansas Army National Guard in December 1994.

Brigadier General Don C. Morrow assumes command of the brigade December 22, 1994.

Annual training 1995 was conducted at Fort Chaffee, Arkansas in preparation for the JRTC rotation in 1996. 2nd
Battalion and 3rd Battalion 153d Infantry are selected to be the maneuver battalions "in the box" at JRTC. 1st Battalion 153d Infantry serves as the OPFOR element during the annual training period.

Brigade and battalion staffs participate in a Leader Training Program (LTP) at Fort Polk, Louisiana in preparation for the 1996 JRTC rotation.

The brigade was notified that it had been selected to become one of fifteen Army National Guard brigades that will be designated as an "enhanced brigade". The enhanced status created more authorizations for personnel and equipment on the MTOEs and signified that training would be focused on attaining higher degrees of readiness, meet earlier deployment times and prepare for more contingencies than any past commitments of the Army National Guard.

During 1996 the brigade and battalion staffs participate in a Leader Training Program (LTP) at Fort Polk, Louisiana in preparation for the 1996-08 JRTC rotation.

FORSCOM's Ground Force
Readiness Enhancement (GFRE)
program is instituted and Active
Component officers and NCOs are
assigned to units of the 39th Infantry
Brigade (Separate) to assist on a daily
basis with developing and implementing
training strategies under the "enhanced
brigade" readiness focus. These soldiers
are initially assigned as members of the
101st Airborne Division.

In June 1996 the brigade deployed to Fort Polk, Louisiana for the JRTC rotation 96-08.

In September 1996 the brigade undergoes the largest reorganization and brigade units are re-stationed throughout the state. 5th Battalion 206th Field Artillery is affected the most by the restationing plan. Units are moved from West Memphis, Harrisburg, Forrest City and Brinkley to Russelville, Morrilton, Dardanelle and Paris. The 439th Signal Platoon at Perryville is de-activated and re-designated as the 239th Military

Intelligence Company. The brigade's Military Police Platoon and Air Defense Artillery Platoon (Stinger) are relocated from Little Rock and Beebe, respectively to West Memphis.

Brigadier General Don C. Morrow is appointed The Adjutant General of the Arkansas National Guard and promoted to Major General upon the retirement of Major General Melvin C. Thrash.

Colonel Walter A. Paulson II assumes command of the brigade on 3 November 1996.

In 1997 the brigade and battalion staffs participate in their first Brigade Command and Battle Staff Training (BCBST) Program seminar at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, which was followed with a Brigade Warfighter Exercise.

Annual training 1997 was conducted at Fort Chaffee using the 5th Army "base cluster" concept in which units nonorganic to the 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) support and participate in the multi-echelon training conducted by the brigade.

The brigade celebrated its Thirtieth Anniversary in December 1997.

In 1998 the brigade is selected to become a member of the Integrated Division Initiative of the Department of the Army. The 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) along with the 41st Infantry Brigade (Separate), Oregon Army National Guard and the 45th Infantry Brigade (Separate), Oklahoma Army National Guard are selected to become members of the reactivated 7th Infantry Division (Integrated) located at Fort Carson, Colorado. Under this organization the 7th Infantry Division provides an active duty division headquarters that has training and

readiness oversight for the three brigades. The commander of the 7th Infantry Division provides training guidance and resources as much as possible to ensure that the three enhanced brigades are prepared to meet the nations needs when called upon.

In January 1999 the brigade is asked by FORSCOM to nominate three rifle companies to participate in Operation Southern Watch, which is a Joint Task Force that provides defensive support to Saudi Arabia and Kuwait. Company B, 3rd Battalion 153d Infantry, Company B, 2nd Battalion 153d Infantry and Company C, 1st Battalion 153d Infantry are selected to deploy to Saudi Arabia and provide defensive support to active component Air Defense Artillery sites on a rotational basis.

In February 1999 the brigade and battalion staffs participate in the Brigade Command and Battle Staff Training (BCBST) Program seminar at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. Which was followed with a Brigade Warfighter Exercise in May 1999.

The Operation Southern Watch mission changed and Company B, 2nd Battalion 153d Infantry was designated to be deployed to Kuwait in June 1998 at the same time as Company B, 3rd Battalion 153d Infantry deployed to Saudi Arabia. The two units conducted extensive training in preparation for their missions at Camp Robinson and Fort Carson, Colorado.

In June 1999 members of the brigade participated in the re-activation ceremony and parade of the 7th Infantry Division at Fort Carson, Colorado. Major General John Riggs assumed command of the 7th Infantry Division.

The brigade conducted annual training at Fort Chaffee and continued to

expand on the "base cluster" concept of training exercises in which almost every Arkansas Army National Guard and some of the Arkansas Air National Guard participated. The exercise was called "Operation Razorback 99".

In August 1999 Major General Edward Soriano assumed command of

the 7th Infantry Division.

After conducting the same training as the first two deploying Operation Southern Watch companies, Company C, 1st Battalion 153d Infantry deployed to Kuwait in October 1999. Companies B from the 2nd and 3rd Battalions 153d Infantry returned to Arkansas in October 1999 from their Operation Southern Watch missions.

In March 2000 the brigade was once again notified by FORSCOM that they were to nominate two infantry line units to conduct operations in the Joint Task Force Operation "Operation Joint Forge" Stabilization Force (SFOR) 9 mission in Bosnia.

Company D, 1st Battalion and Company D, 3rd Battalion 153d Infantry were selected as the two units that would train for the SFOR 9 mission in Bosnia. The units conducted annual training 2000 at Fort Carson, Colorado by completing individual soldier training tasks that were required for deployment to the Bosnia Theater of operations.

Brigadier General Ronald S. Chastain assumed command of the 39th Infantry

Brigade (Separate) in July 2000.

In October 2000 3rd Battalion 153d Infantry conducted annual training for FY-2001 at Fort Chaffee. The focus of the annual training period was to support Company D from 1st Battalion and Company D, 3rd Battalion 153d Infantry in collective training tasks that were required for unit validation prior to their deployment to Bosnia.

Company D from 1st Battalion and Company D, 3rd Battalion 153d Infantry continued their training for the "Operation Joint Forge" mission by participating in exercises at Fort Stewart, Georgia in December 2000 and Fort Polk, Louisiana with the 48th Infantry Brigade (Separate) from the Georgia Army National Guard and the Third Infantry Division respectively.

The uniqueness of the SFOR 9 mission was that the Third Infantry Division, an active component division, was the designated headquarters for the "Operation Joint Forge" rotation. The 48th Infantry Brigade (Separate), an Army National Guard brigade was designated as the parent infantry brigade for the mission. The 1st Squadron of the 7th Cavalry Regiment the designated unit that the two Arkansas companies were assigned to during SFOR 9.

In March 2000 the brigade and battalion staffs participate in the Brigade Command and Battle Staff Training (BCBST) Program seminar at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. Which was followed with a Brigade Warfighter Exercise at the end of the annual training period at Fort Chaffee in June 2000.

Companies D of the 1st Battalion and 3rd Battalion 153d Infantry deployed to Bosnia in April 2000.

The brigade continued to conduct annual training at Fort Chaffee in June 2000 that emphasized company lanes training in attack operations.

After a successful completion of their missions Companies D of the 1st Battalion and 3rd Battalion 153d Infantry redeployed to their home stations in October 2001.

Major General Charles C. Campbell assumed command of the 7th Infantry Division (Integrated) in October 2001.

After 11 September 2001 became the new day of infamy for the United States of America, the 39th Infantry Brigade was called on to provide security forces on state active duty at Camp Robinson, the Nuclear One power plant in Russellville, a government contractor industrial park in Camden, and the Texarkana Airport in Texarkana, Arkansas.

The 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) received notice in October 2001 that one infantry battalion was to be mobilized and deployed, as part of the Multinational Force and Observer (MFO) Program under the Article VI-United Nations Operations, to Annex I – Protocol Concerning Israeli Withdrawal and Security Arrangements to the 1978 Treaty of Peace between Israel and Egypt. The 2nd Battalion 153d Infantry was selected to be the Task Force headquarters to perform this mission.

The Task Force consisted of members from all units of the 2nd Battalion 153d Infantry. The Military Police Platoon from 39th Infantry Brigade Headquarters Company, engineers from 239th Engineer Company, medical personnel from Company C (Medical), 39th Support Battalion, infantry soldiers from the 3rd Battalion 153d Infantry and specialty soldiers from the California and Missouri National Guard completed the makeup of the task force.

After three days of mobilization alert the battalion was mobilized at their home stations and began individual soldier processing for deployment. Six Hundred and thirty-five soldiers were mobilized and sent to Fort Carson, Colorado for individual and collective training in preparation for the mission.

After training was completed and the unit was validated 529 soldiers were designated to be deployed to the Sinai Peninsula in Egypt during January 2002. As of this writing the task force assumed their mission in the Sinai on 12 January 2002.

Today the members of the 39th
Infantry Brigade (Separate) continue to stand ready as a efficient, flexible, well-trained and equipped force ready to answer the call were ever that we are needed for our state and our country to ensure that freedom can and will prevail.

Traditionally, when you think of the 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) and its vast array of weapons for the individual soldier, you may envision rifles, machine guns, missiles, or artillery. Yes, we exist in an age of modern technology and weaponry. Among this array of weapons exists a weapon that holds its birth here in our great state. The Bowie Knife. Some may consider this piece of equipment as antiquated or nonfunctional, but this knife has served our troops admirably from the late 1830s to today. The Bowie Knife we have come to know and admire traces its roots back to Washington, Arkansas in the late 1830s. The famous blacksmith and knife maker, James Black, first made it. As legend has it, James Bowie was traveling through Arkansas and stopped in Washington to see Mr. Black. Mr. Bowie's intention was to have Mr. Black make him a knife of his (Bowie's) own design. Mr. Bowie had selected Mr. Black since Mr. Black was an expert in tempering steel and was renowned to be the best knife maker in the Southwest. Mr. Bowie left a knife pattern that he had whittled out of wood with Mr. Black for the new knife design. Mr. Black agreed to undertake this request to produce the knife in one month for Mr. Bowie. The knife blade was to be made of the finest material, possess a heavy hand guard, and be balanced for throwing.

As the appointed month passed, Mr. Bowie returned to Mr. Black's shop. Mr. Black had made a knife to Bowie's pattern as requested and had also made a similar knife with his own modifications. Both of these knives were single edged, but Mr. Black's knife design had a curved point of two edges. This made it possible to either stab or slash with the knife. Mr. Bowie was pleased with these modifications and took Mr. Black's knife in place of the knife he had designed.

Shortly after Mr. Bowie had acquired his new knife, he had an occasion to use it. Being attacked by three men who had been hired to kill him, Mr. Bowie drew his knife. He slashed at the first man, beheading him; utilized an upward stab, killing the second man and the third man attempted to run away. Mr. Bowie gave chase and delivered a downward swing blow to the top of the man's head, killing him. This fight made both Mr. Bowie and Mr. Black famous. Soon Mr. Black was deluged with requests from all over the Southwest for knives "like Bowie's".

Mr. James Black was the only man who knew how to make the real Bowie Knife. He had developed a secret way of making fine steel, which no one could duplicate. He never divulged this secret and took it with him to the grave in 1872. Mr. Black lies in an unmarked grave in a cemetery at

HISTORY OF THE 39TH INFANTRY BRIGADE "BOWIE KNIFE"

Washington Arkansas. Mr. Bowie was considered to be a businessman, explorer, and soldier. He gallantly gave his life during the battle at the Alamo during the Texas War of Independence in 1836.

Soon after the 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate) formation on December 1, 1967, the Bowie Knife was adopted as a part of the brigade insignia and as the individual weapon of brigade field grade officers, the Commanding General's aide-de-camp, and more recently the Command Sergeants Major, Sergeants Major, and Chief Warrant Officer Four (CW4). A distinctive and honored award from the brigade, the knife is modified from the original design to be more suitable for close combat. It is indicative of the aggressive, fighting spirit of the infantry.


Only knives that are procured by order of the brigade commander are authorized for wear or presentation. General officers are authorized a knife with an ivory handle. Colonels wear knives with stag handles, while other field grad officers and the aide-de-camp wear black handles. CW4s are authorized to wear walnut handles. The ranks of Command Sergeants Major and Sergeants Major are authorized to wear the cherry wood handle and retired Master Sergeants are authorized coco-bolo handles. Honorees are presented a knife commensurate with their rank. All

former brigade members and persons who have been honored by the presentation of the brigade Bowie Knife may wear it on ceremonial occasions.

A native knife maker conceived the Bowie Knife in Arkansas and today this knife continues to be produced in Arkansas. Until his death, each presentation grade knife was hand make by Mr. Jimmy Lile of Russellville. Arkansas. Mr. Lile was also commissioned to make the knives made by Sylvester Stallone in the "Rambo" movies. The Lile family continues to make the "Bowie Knife" for the Brigade. The general public cannot purchase one of these knives, but can purchase a different style based on the Bowie Knife pattern.

Each brigade Bowie Knife bears the recipient's name, social security number, rank, and military branch, as well as the maker's name and serial number of the knife. The Brigade Bowie Knife, a work of superb craftsmanship, identifies the bearer as a member of the elite, the 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate), the "ARKANSAS BRIGADE".







Shoulder Sleeve Insignia

Symbolism: The Bowie knife alludes to the "The Bowie State" a nickname used for Arkansas, home station of the Brigade. The Bowie knife, a weapon used for close fighting and implying hand-to-hand combat, is also indicative of the aggressive spirit of the Infantry. The lozenge or diamond refers to the unique aspect of the state as having the only diamond field in North America.




Distinctive Unit Insignia

Motto: Courage

Symbolism: The three stars stand for France, Spain, and the United States, the countries to which the Arkansas Territory belonged. The diamond shape was suggested by the state flag, while the wavy bar symbolizes the Arkansas River with the arrow referring to the Indian name ARKANSA. The green background alludes to the wooded hills of the Ouachita National Forests. The arrow in flight is used as a symbol of the 39th Infantry Brigade defending the state.

Shoulder Sleeve Insignia

Symbolism: Red, white and blue are our National colors. The Greek letter recalls the Delta of the Mississippi and with the English "D" the two letters recall the popular name of the Division

Background: The Secretary of War approved the shoulder sleeve insignia on 8 Feb 1922.

153rd Infantry (FIRST ARKANSAS)



DISTINCTIVE UNIT INSIGNIA

Motto: "LET'S GO"

Symbolism: The wavy bend, for the Arkansas River, refers to the geographic location of the regiment. The cactus symbolizes service on the Mexican border and the fleur-de-lis is for service in France during World War I. The great bear's face, from the shoulder sleeve insignia of the Alaskan Department, symbolizes service in Alaska during World War II.

1-206 Field Artillery



DISTINCTIVE UNIT INSIGNIA

Motto: "Never Give Up"

Symbolism: Scarlet and blue were the colors of Machine Gun Battalions during WWI and refer to the service of the 141st Machine Gun Battalion, which became a part of the regiment when it was originally organized. The scarlet is also the color used for Artillery. The Blue may also signify the close fire support that the battalion provides to the infantry as part of the combined arms team as well as its infantry roots. The escarbuncle is taken from the coat of arms of Chaumont, one of the principle towns in the Department of Haute-Marne, France where the 141st Machine Gun Battalion was stationed during WWI.

39th Support Battalion



DISTINCTIVE UNIT INSIGNIA

Motto: "Support, Spirit, Success"

Symbolism: Scarlet and Buff are the colors used for Support. The fret (formed by the satire and the mascle) is symbolic of the interlaced support provided the combat elements. The blue mascle also alludes to the blue band bordering the white diamond of the Arkansas state flag and refers to the home area of the organization. The blue may also signify the important logistical support that the battalion provides to the infantry as part of the combined arms team.

DISTINCTIVE UNIT INSIGNIA

Motto: "Lead the Way"

Symbolism: Yellow is the traditional color used by Cavalry units. The horse symbolizes the proud heritage and tradition of Cavalry. The Chevron suggests the forward motion, underscoring the unit's motto. The Polestar, adapted from the compass rose, highlights the leadership and direction while alluding to the North Star, commemorating the unit's WW II service in the Aleutians. Black and white refers to night and day and "around the clock" military capabilities. E Troop proudly serves as the Infantry Brigade Commander's eyes and ears on the combined arms battlefield.

F Battery, 202 Air Defense Artillery



DISTINCTIVE UNIT INSIGNIA

Motto: "Arte et Armis"

Symbolism: The shield is blue to indicate the Infantry origin of the Regiment and perhaps the air defense support the battery provides the infantry. The three piles represent the rays of the Artillery searchlights; the winged projectile is scarlet for Artillery; the wings indicate the antiaircraft aspect of the parent organization. On a wreath of the colors upon a great field sits the blockhouse of old Fort Dearborn signifying the Regiment's home state of Illinois.

239th Engineer Company



DISTINCTIVE UNIT INSIGNIA

Motto: "Essayons"

Symbolism: Scarlet and white are the colors of the Corps of Engineers. The triple-turreted castle has been in use by the Corps of Engineers since it was adopted in 1840. Prior to that time, an insignia of a similar design was worn on the uniforms of the Corps of Cadets of the United States Military Academy since the Academy was under the supervision and direction of the Chief of Engineers. Selection of the turreted castle as the Engineer insignia followed the first major construction undertaken by the Corps of Engineers -- the building of a system of castle-like fortifications for the protection of harbors along the Atlantic Coast. These fortifications, many of which are still standing, were in fact called "castles." The 239th Engineer Company carries the primary responsibility to ensure the mobility, counter-mobility and survivability for the combined arms team.

239th Military Intelligence Company



DISTINCTIVE UNIT INSIGNIA

Motto: "Always Out Front"

Symbolism: The Sphinx at the shield's center has been associated with U.S. military intelligence since 1923, when it was adopted as the insignia of the Military Intelligence Officers Reserve Corps. This mythological creature has exemplified the combination of wisdom with strength from ancient times to the present. The Key and Lightingbolt represent Knowledge and Speed. The Motto "Always Out Front" is a reminder that the members of the Corps are continuously in action against the enemy's of our nation.

Symbolism: The designation is adapted from the hourglass symbol of the divisions shoulder sleeve insignia. The bayonet, a reference to the nickname "Bayonet Division", became synonymous with the division though its participation in the Korean War and symbolizes the fighting spirit of the men of the 7th Infantry Division.
